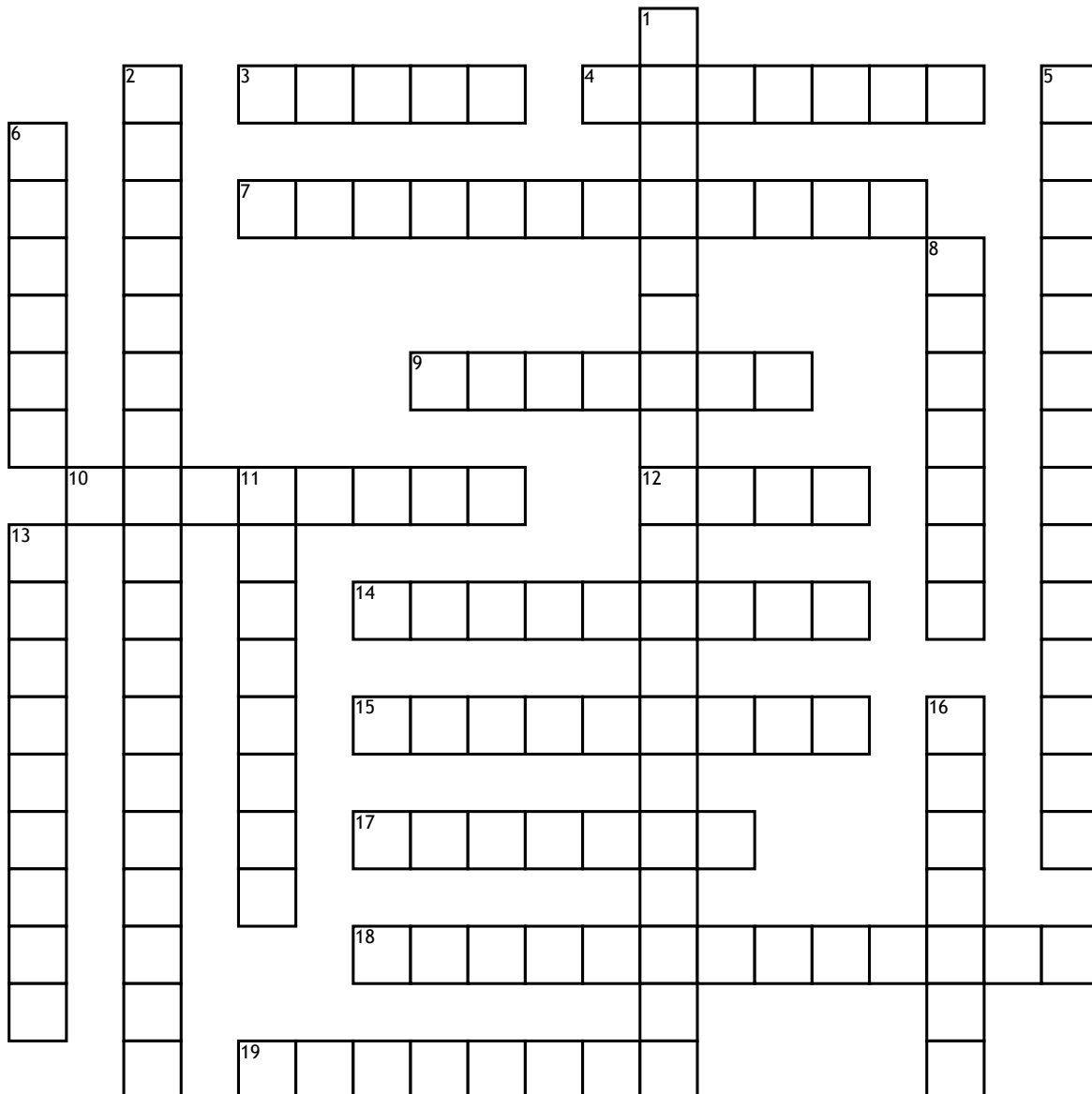


Glaciers

3. A long ridge of gravel and other sediment.
 4. A mass of rocks and sediment carried down and deposited by a glacier.
 7. A river that is either too large or too small to have eroded the valley or cave passage in which it flows.
 9. Move back
 10. A permanent layer of ice covering an extensive tract of land, especially a polar region.
 12. Also known as, bolder clay.

14. Is an extensive flat plain of glacial till.

15. The water may drain from the lake, leaving the deposited sediments behind.

17. Move forward

18. Are formed by the process of glaciation.

19. A slowly moving mass or river of ice formed by the accumulation and compaction of snow on mountains or near the poles.

1. Moves under the weight of its self.

2. The area above the firn line.

5. Moves under the weight of gravity.

8. A rock or boulder that differs from the surrounding rock.

11. Debris or material deposited by a glacier.
