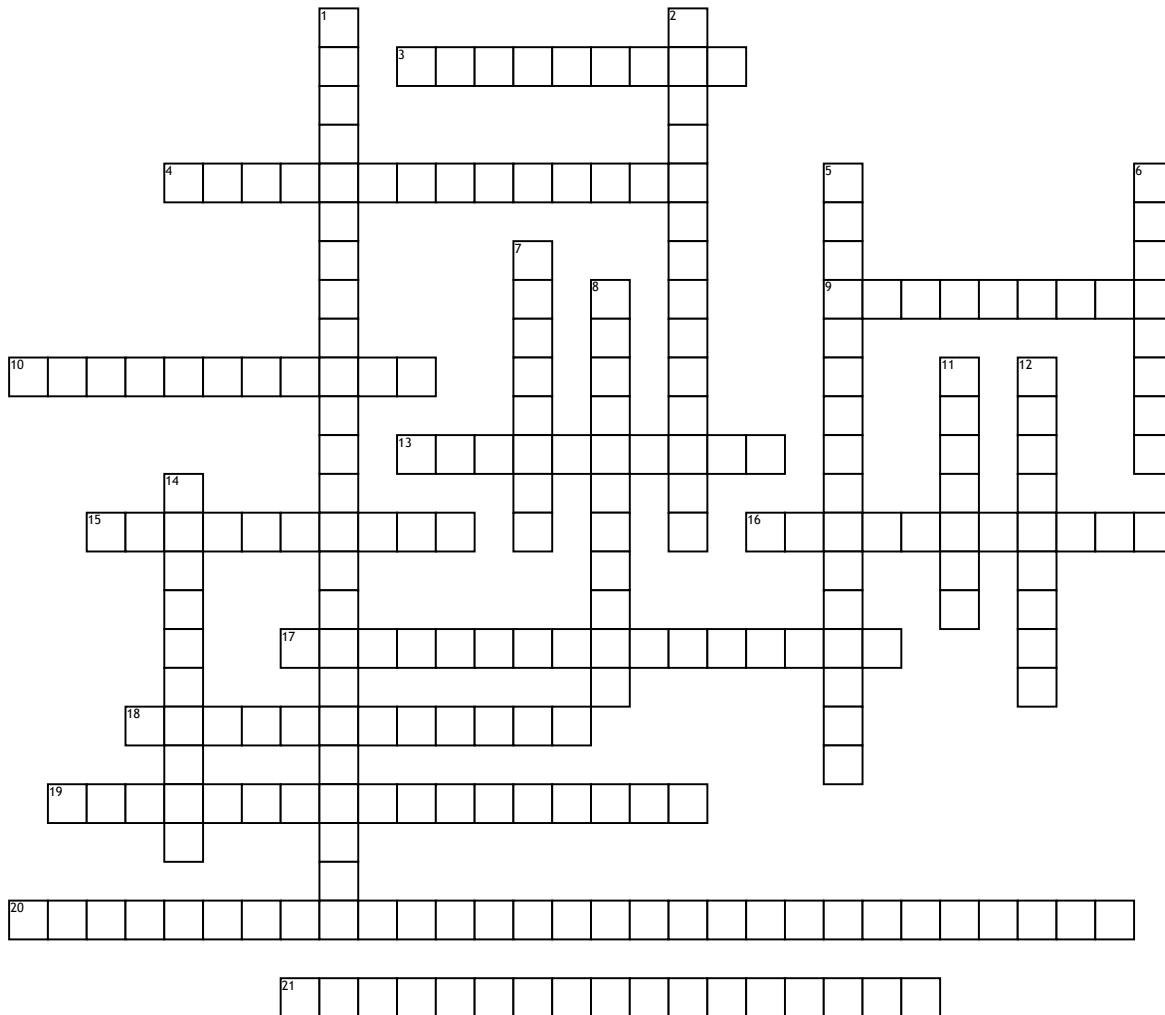

6. those powers that the Constitution does not grant to the National Government and does not, at the same time, deny to the States

7. Powers the Constitution is presumed to have delegated to the National Government because it is the government of a sovereign state within the world community
