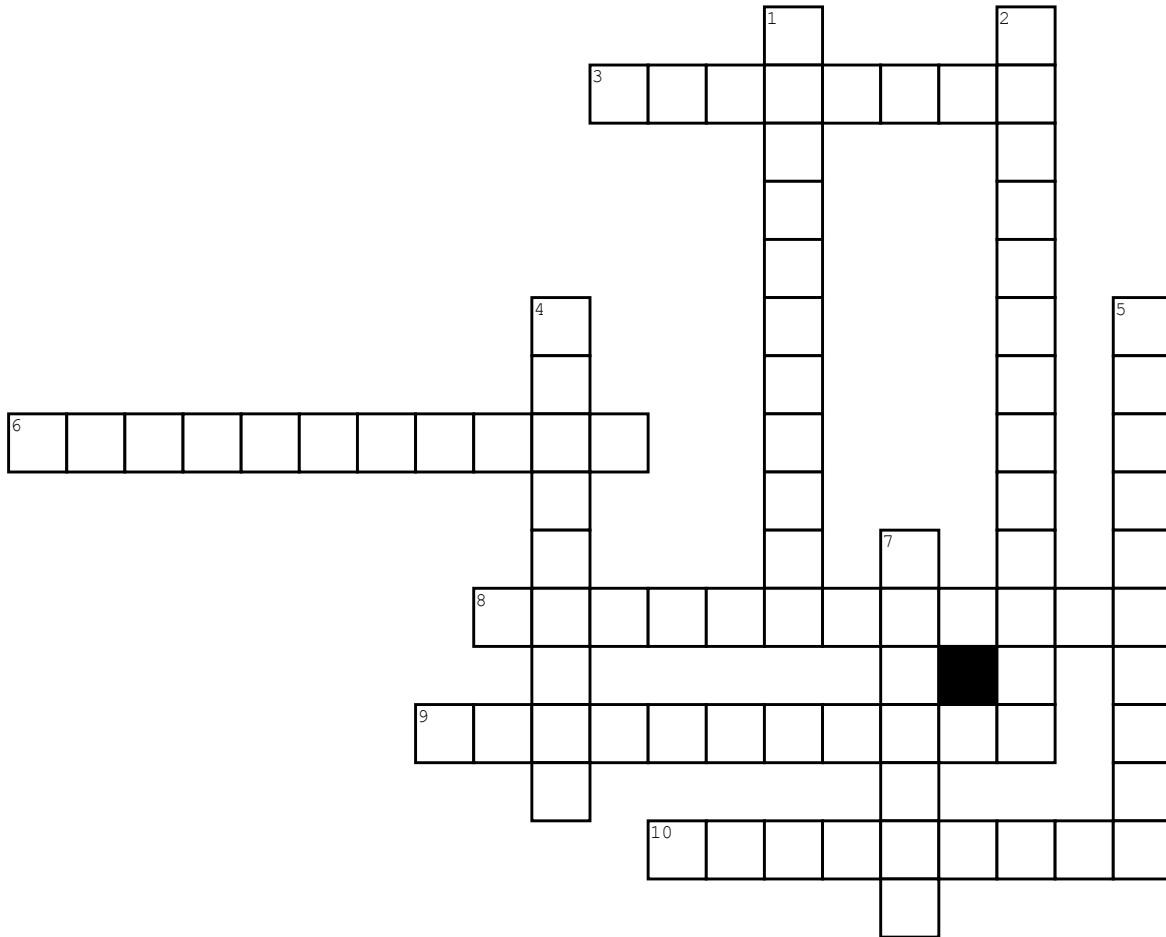


Great Depression Crossword

9. a day on which banks are officially closed, observed as a public holiday
10. a general increase in prices and fall in the purchasing value of money

1. refers to the collection of markets and exchanges; issuing and trading of stocks, bonds, and other securities takes place
2. October 29, 1929; on this day a record number of shares were traded on the New York Stock Exchange by panicked investors
4. a line of people waiting to receive free food
5. a deprived area on the outskirts of a town consisting of large numbers of crude dwellings
7. a group of government programs and policies established under President Franklin Roosevelt in the 1930's, it was designed to improve conditions for persons suffering in the Great Depression
