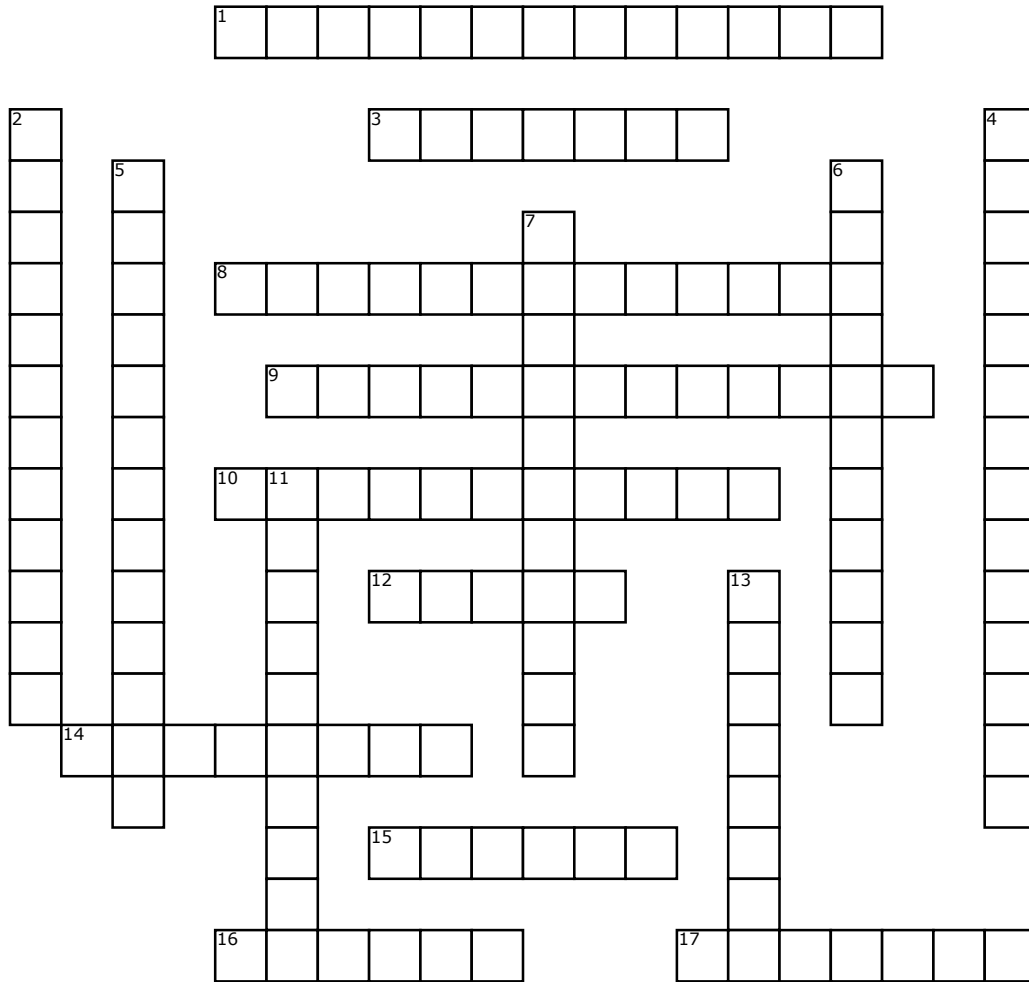

10. noun; a person's or animal's nature, especially as it permanently affects their behavior
