
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Haircutting



<u>Across</u>

- **4.** Near or on the parallel to the the horizon.
- **10.** A technique that achieves closeness to the head. A comb is used as a guide to hold the lengths in position for sculpting while using clippers
- 11. A progression of shorter lengths towards the top of the head, creating an activated surface.
- **12.** A combination form that is the result of sculpting along horizontal and/or vertical planes; multiple forms occur automatically form due to the curve of the head.
- **14.** A technique that achieves closeness to the head. A comb is used as a guide to hold the lengths in position for sculpting while using shears

- **17.** A line with a slanted slope or direction
- **18.** The arrangements of legnths across the curve of the head
- **19.** The direction hair assumes when its combed at a 90 degree angle to its base partings.
- **20.** Sculpting at the perimeter or within the form to achieve textural qualities, design mobility or expansion.

- 1. An arrangement of shapes, lines and ornamental effects that creates an artistic unit.
- 2. The sculpting technique that produces a stacked effect in the hair.
- **3.** The angle the hair is held in relation to the curve of the head while sculpting.

- **5.** A diagonal line that travels away from the face resulting in a backwards flow of the hair.
- 6. Circumference, border or outer boundary, the hair around the hair line 7. Intervals of 2" (5cm) that echo from
- the curve of the head and are used to analyze hair length.
