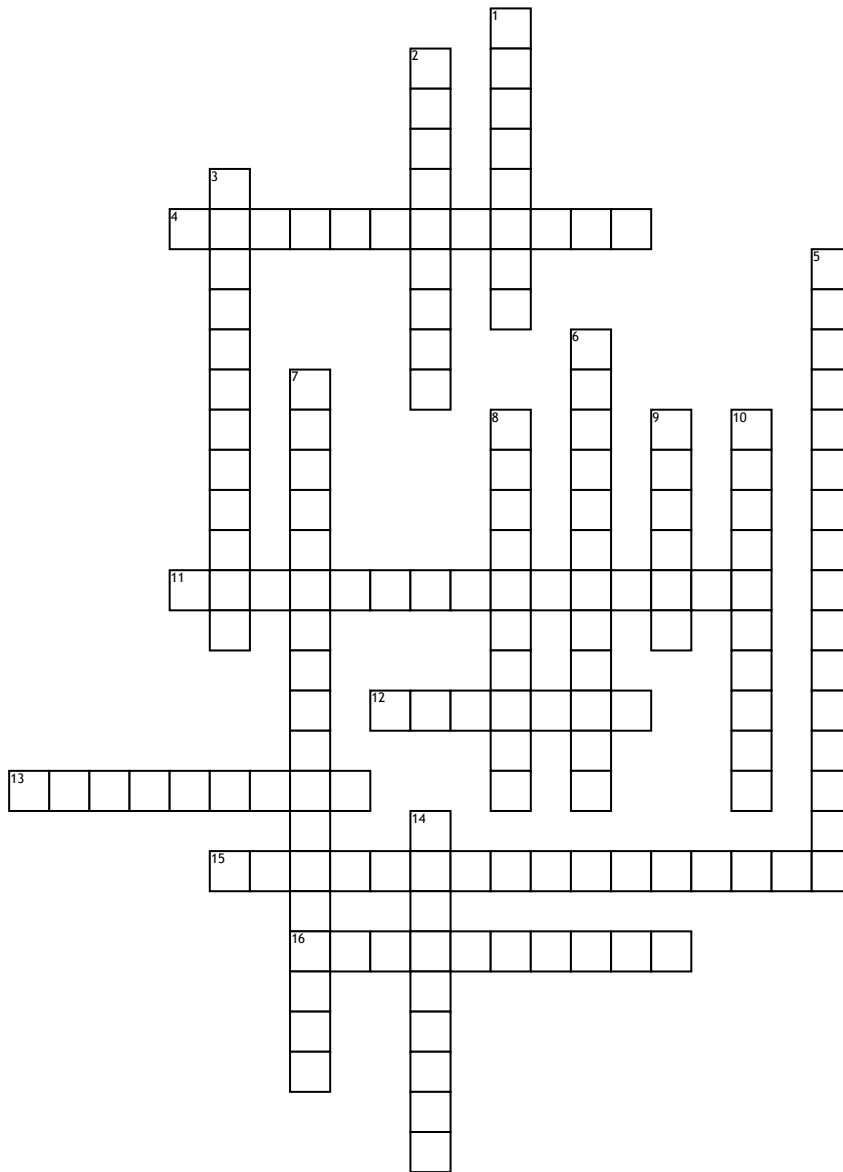

4. any of a class of sedative and sleep-inducing drugs derived from barbituric acid.
 11. a synthetic drug with more rapid and lasting effects than amphetamine, used illegally as a stimulant and as a prescription drug to treat narcolepsy and maintain blood pressure.
 12. an addictive drug derived from coca or prepared synthetically, used as an illegal stimulant and sometimes medicinally as a local anesthetic
 13. cannabis, especially as smoked in cigarettes
 15. a pharmaceutical drug that legally requires a medical prescription to be dispensed
 16. using a drug in excessive quantities.

1. chemicals found in such household products as aerosol sprays & cleaning fluids that are sniffed or "Huffed"
 2. a substance that raises levels of physiological or nervous activity in the body.
 3. a drug that causes hallucinations, such as LSD
 5. substances that can change the consciousness, mood, and thoughts of those who take them
 6. a synthetic, addictive, mood-altering drug, used illegally as a stimulant and legally as a prescription drug to treat children with ADD and adults with narcolepsy.

7. Medicines sold directly to the consumer which may be sold only to consumers possessing a valid prescription
 8. occasionally referred to as "downers" as they lower the level of arousal when taken.
 9. a highly addictive analgesic drug derived from morphine, often used illicitly as a narcotic producing euphoria.
 10. a secondary, typically undesirable effect of a drug or medical treatment.
