

- 3. Born deaf
- **5.** Measure of sound intensity
- **9.** Less than normal hearing resulting from auditory disorder(s).
- 11. The air-filled space behind the eardrum that contains three tiny bones (ossicles) that carry sound to the inner ear
- **14.** The snail-shaped part of the ear (cochlea) containing the organs of hearing and balance
- **15.** Hearing is nonfunctional for the ordinary processes of life

16. Born with normal hearing but has now become nonfunctional through illness or accident

- 1. Caused by defects of the inner
- **2.** Allows signals to bypass the middle ear and be transmitted directly to the inner ear by vibrating the bones of the skull
- **4.** Result of damage to the central nervous system
- **6.** Practice of delivering sound tones to an individual via air conduction (headphones) and measuring recognition on an audiometer

- **7.** Interference of sound through the outer and middle ear
- **8.** Both conductive and sensorineural loss
- **10.** Sense of hearing is defective but functional, either with or without a hearing aid, for the purpose of processing linguistic information
- **12.** The most visible (external) part of the ear, useful in funneling sound to the ear canal and in localizing the source of sound
