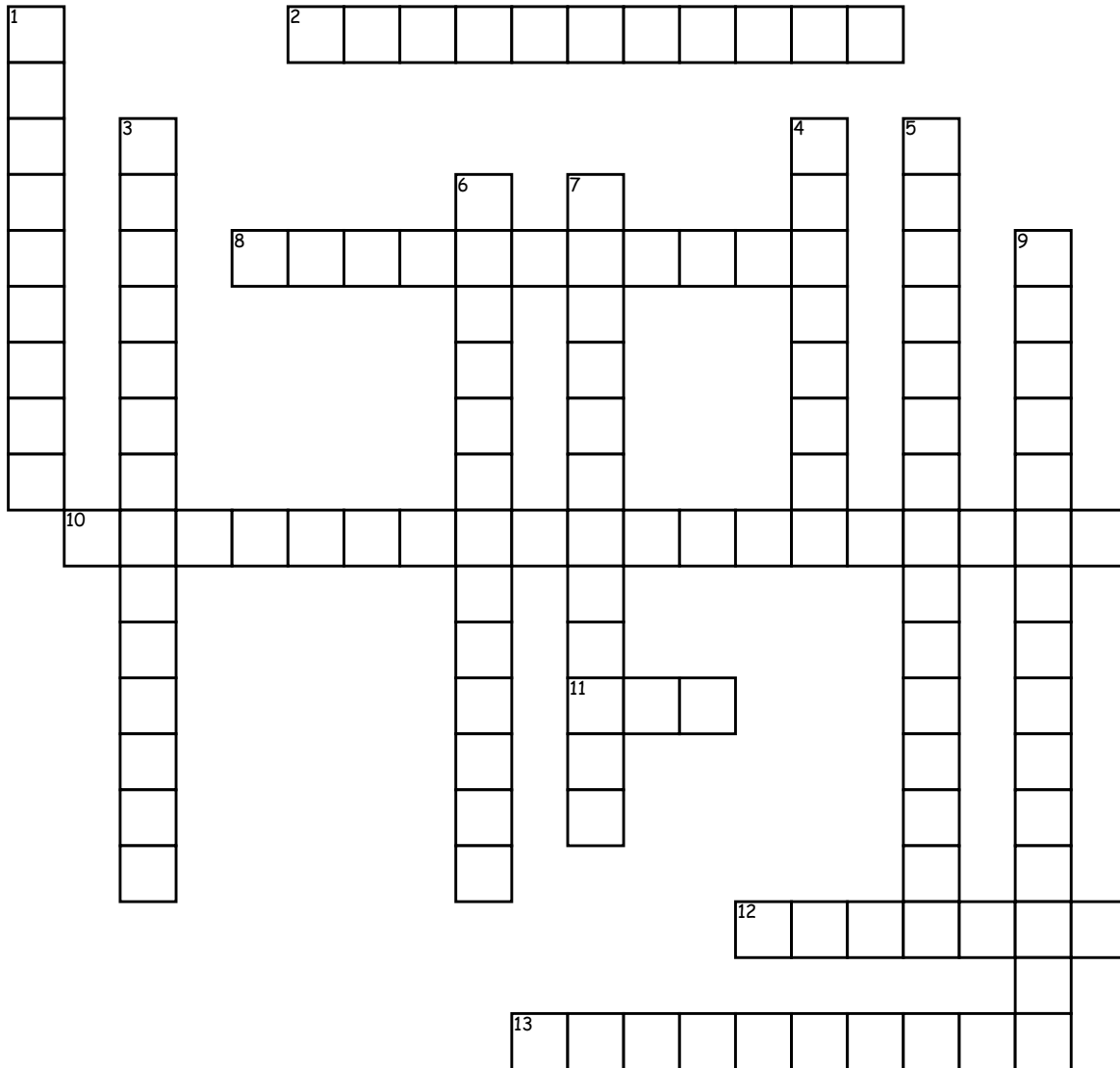

3. In the early 1880s, the Knights of Labor was a union membership that had a great success with its acceptance of all laborers, which included women. In 1886, with their 700,000+ members, the Knights mainly focused on organizations of workers into local unions in order to get practical gains.

4. A controlling civil group that is brought from a population to take control of others. They were involved with killing and wounding many people during the strikes in the Pennsylvania in 1877.

5. A theory that all societies were in a constant competitive struggle to rise to the top. "The survival of the fittest," as Darwin had coined, was the term individuals used to identify with in the competition of businesses. Only the fittest were said to be the ones who would survive in the business world.

6. Workers and Unions gathered in Chicago to protest unfair working conditions and the implementation of an eight hour working day. During the protest a bomb went off and killed protesters and policeman. The death of the cops sparked national outcry.

7. This law allowed male citizens to obtain land in the west only if they will improve the land by plowing fields, building houses and barns, or digging wells.
