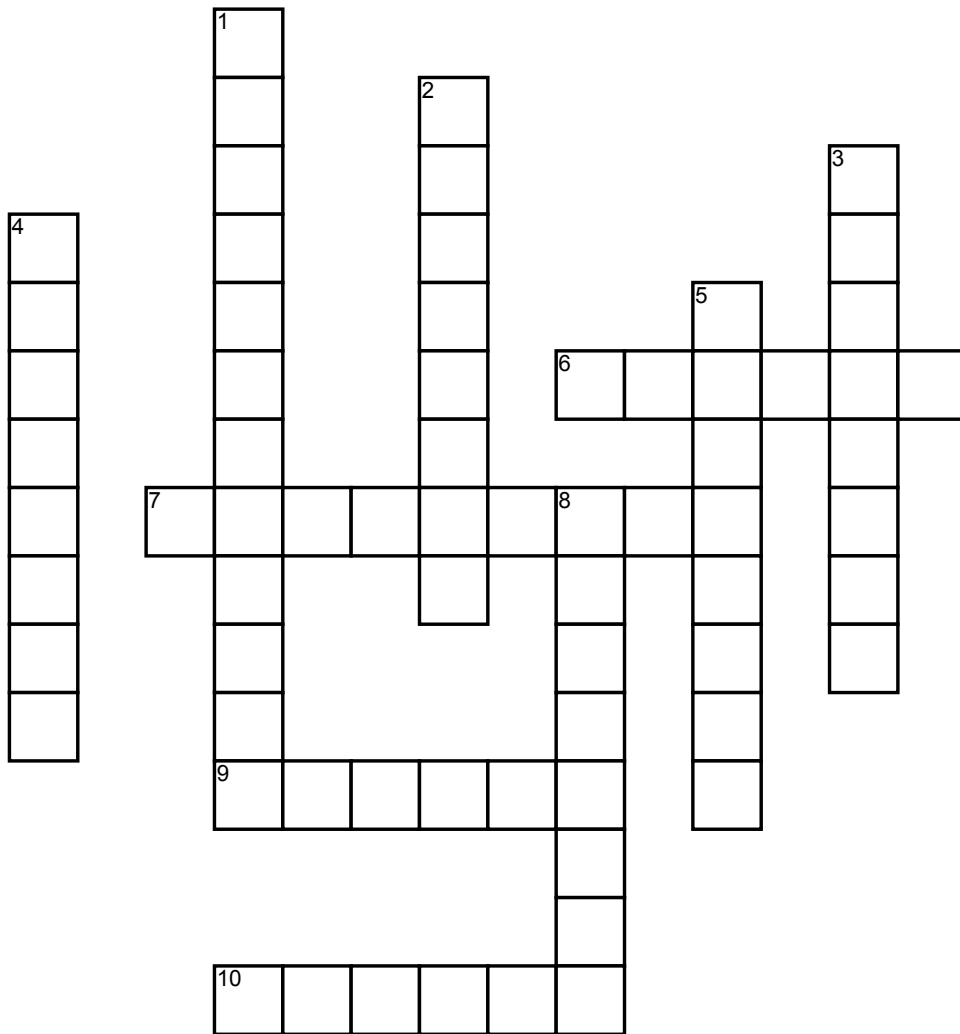

- 3. Carthage was the center or capital city of the ancient Carthaginian Civilization, on the eastern side of the lake Tunis in what is now the Tunis Governorate in Tunisia
- 4. The punic Wars were a series of three wars fought between Rome and Carthage from 264 BC to 146 BC.
- 5. Is a town in Greece and the site of the battle of Marathon in 490 BC, in which the heavily outnumbered Athenian army defeated the Persians
