

- 1. This was the first military engagement. This battle was known for the shot heard 'round the world. Paul Revere notified everyone about this.
- 2. This was a political protest that occurred on December 16, 1773 in Boston. The Americans were angry about England's "'taxation without representation". So they dumped 342 chests of British tea into the harbor.
- **3.** It was signed in Paris by the representatives of King George III. It set the boundaries between the British and North America. It also included finishing rights.
- **5.** It was a small, but pivotal battle. Took place right after Christmas on December 26. 1776. This was a victory for the colonists
- **7.** Pamphlet written by Thomas Paine. It advocates independence from Great Britain. This pamphlet was very famous.
