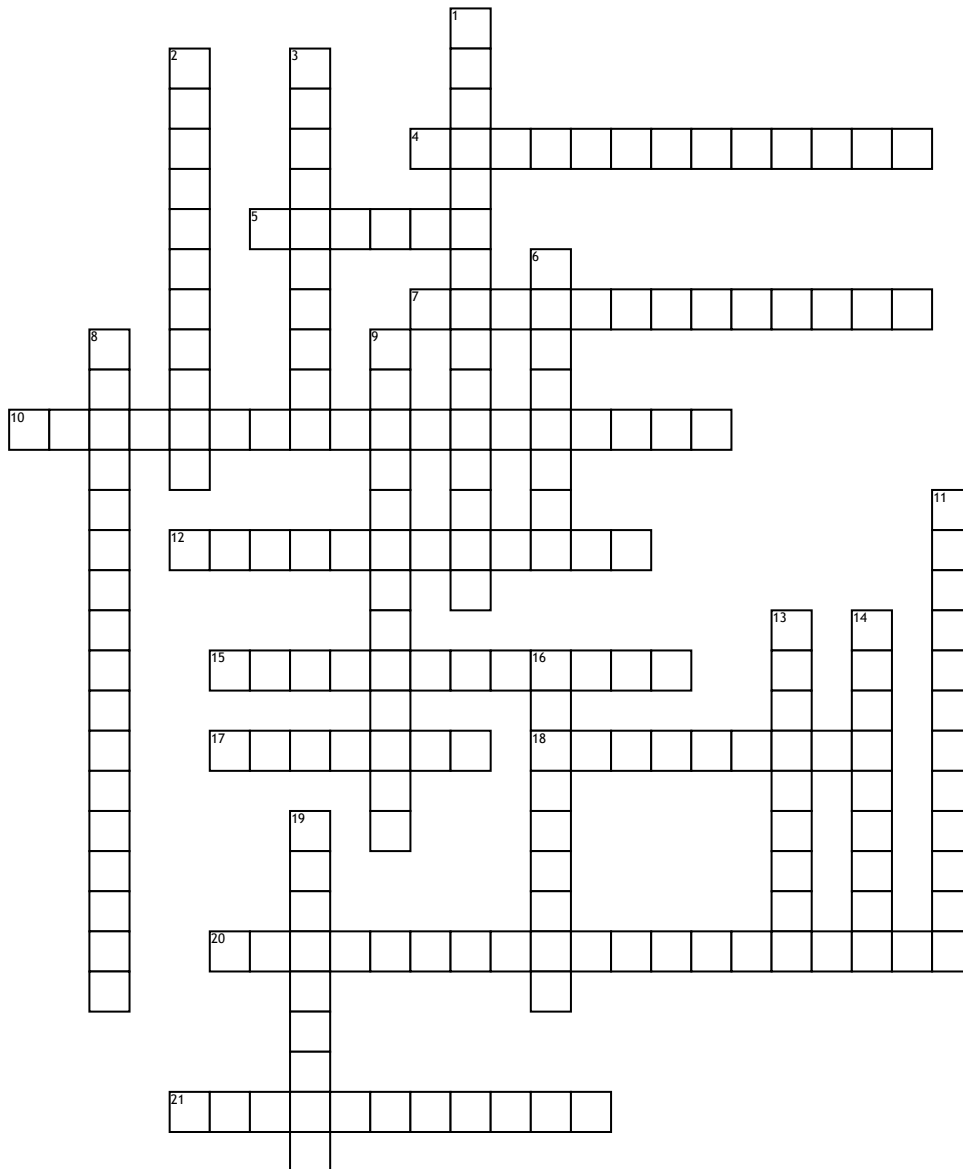


Holocaust Crossword

4. Term used by the Nazis to describe their plan to annihilate the entire Jewish population of Europe.
5. A section of a city where Jews were forced to live, usually with several families living in one house, separated from the rest of the city by walls or wire fences, and used primarily as a station for gathering Jews for deportation to concentration
7. Anti-Jewish laws enacted in 1935; included denial of German citizenship to those of Jewish heritage and segregation of them from German society; also established "degrees of Jewishness" based on family lines.
10. Established in occupied Poland with special apparatus especially designed for mass murder.
12. Performed cruel medical experiments on twin children and was known as the 'Angel of Death.'
