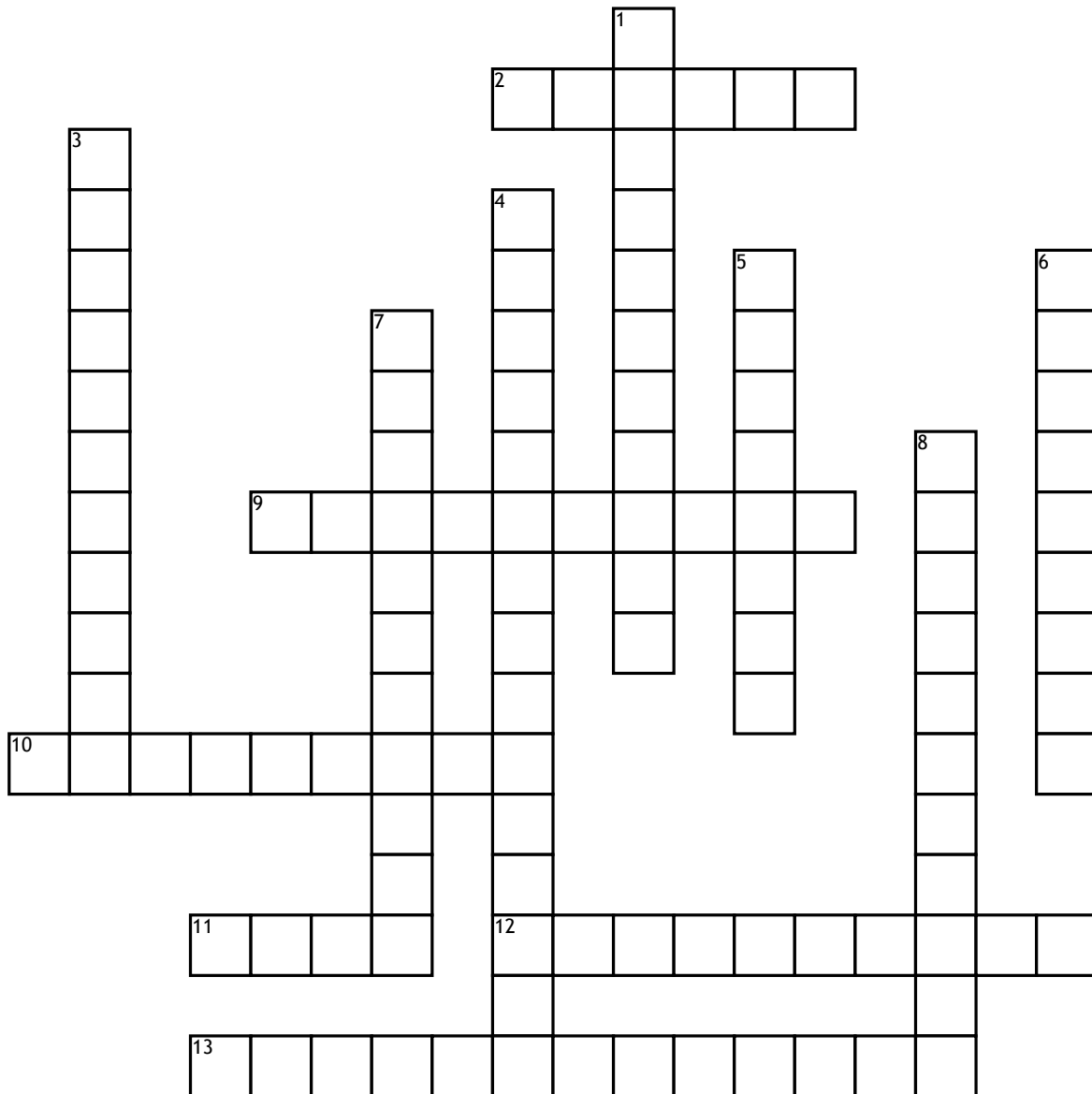


# Hypercapnia/Pneumonia
