

- a bloodborne infection in which the virus damages or kills the T cells of the immune system
- **13.** a general term applied to malignancies affecting lymphoid tissues
- **14.** describes the function of destroying worn-out erythrocytes (RBC) and releasing their hemoglobin for reuse
- **15.** produced in response to the presence of antigens, particularly viruses or tumor cells; they activate the immune system, fight viruses, and signal other cells to increase their defenses
- **16.** the process by which cancer is spread to a new site; may refer to the tumor itself
- **17.** becoming progressively worse and life-threatening
- **19.** an acute viral infection characterized by painful skin eruptions that follow the underlyinh route of the inflamed nerve

- **20.** any disease process affecting a lymph node or nodes
- 21. breast cancer that starts in the milk duct, breaks through the wall of that duct, and invades the surrounding fatty breast tissue; also known as invasive ductal carcinoma
- **22.** one of three types of cells that are formed in bone marrow as stem cells that act as specialized antibodies

- 1. a radiographic examination of the breasts to detect the presence of tumors or precancerrous cells
- **2.** swelling due to an abnormal accumulation of lymph fluid within the tissues
- **3.** a substance that prevents or reduces the body's normal immune response
- **4.** a treatment of disease by either stimulating or repressing the immune response
- **5.** bind with specific antigens in the antigen-antibody response

- **6.** a diagnostic test to detect damage or malformation of the lymphatic vessels
- 7. an infection caused by the Epstein-Barr virus (EBV) that is characterized by fever, a sore throat, and enlarged lymph nodes
- 8. to spread from one place to another
- **9.** a benign tumor formed by an abnormal collection of lymphatic vessels due to a congenital malformation of the lymphatic system
- 11. a malignancy of the lymphatic system that is distinguished from non-Hodgkin's lymphoma by the presence of large, cancerous lymphocytes
- **12.** a type of leukocyte that surrounds and kills invading cells
- **18.** a disease caused by a parasite that lives in certain mosquitoes and is transferred to humans by the bite of an infected mosquito
