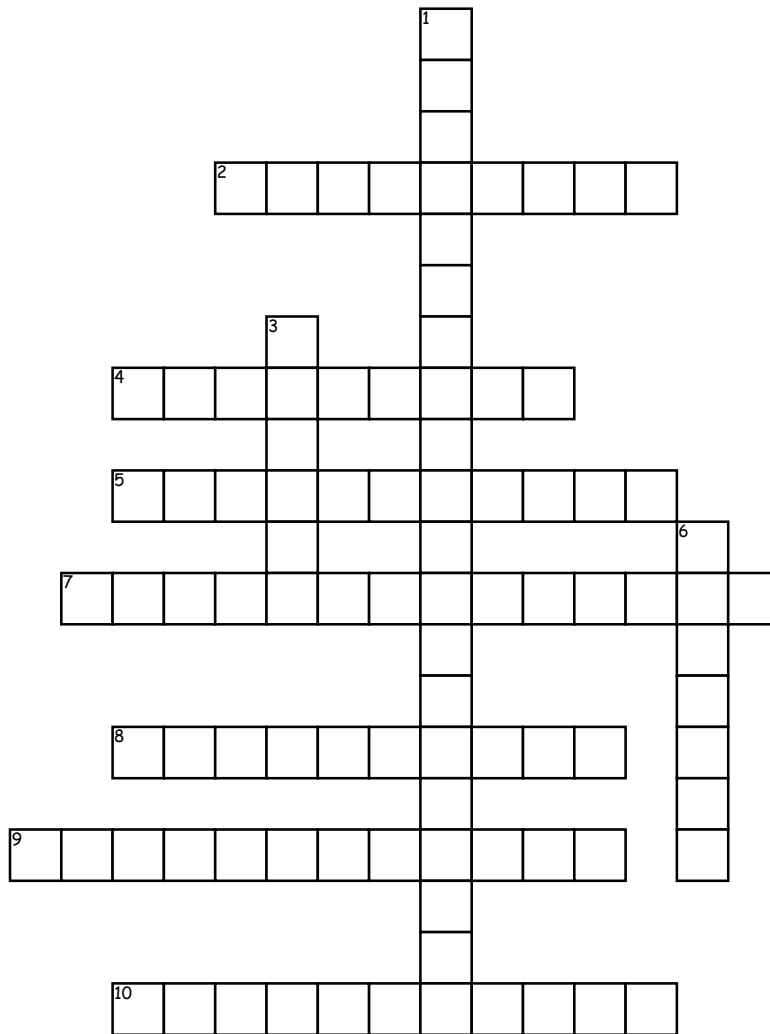


Industrial Revolution
