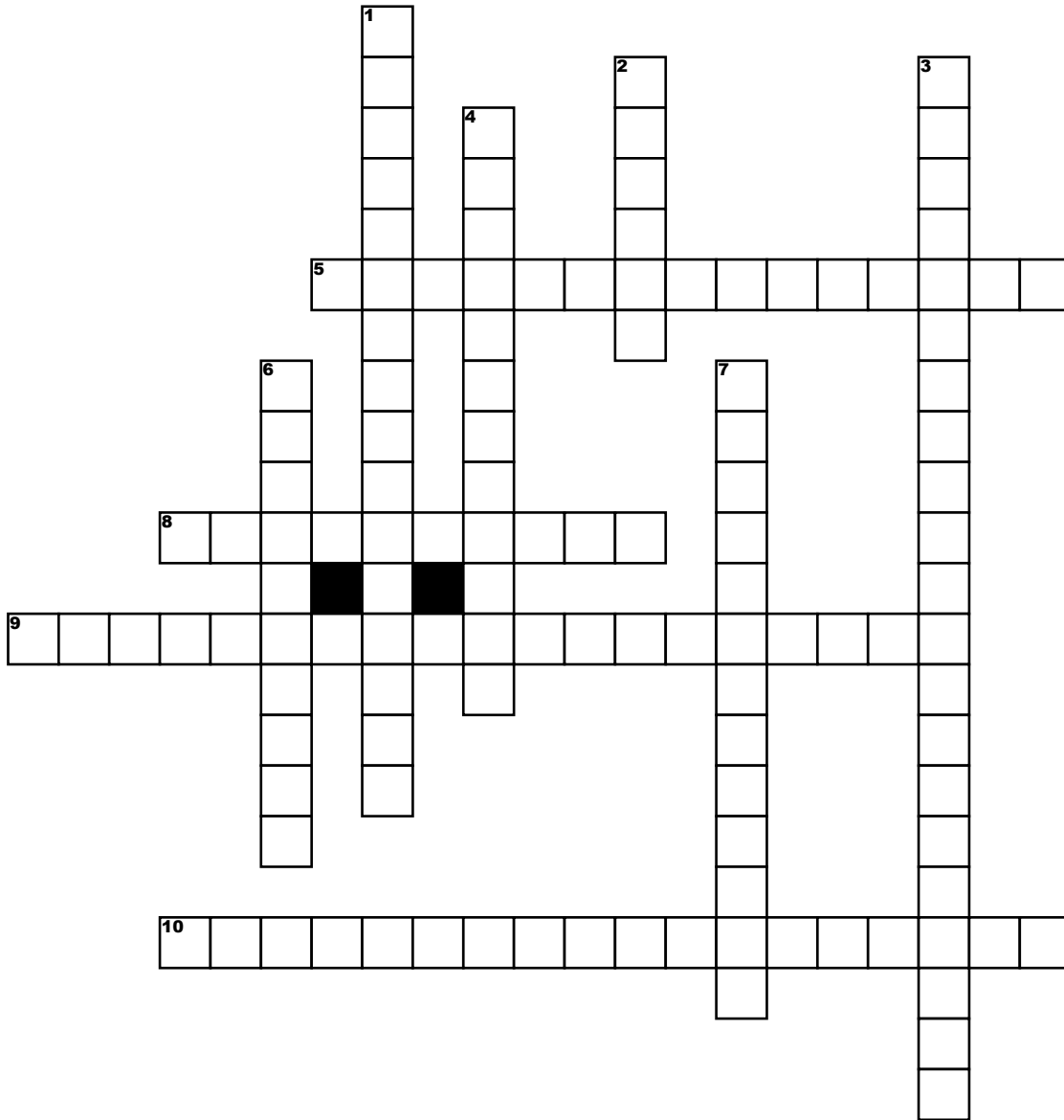

- 2. INSTINCTIVE, INVOLUNTARY BODY REACTIONS TO STIMULI SUCH AS NOISE OR TOUCH**
- 3. SKILLS THAT REQUIRE THE COORDINATION OF VISION INTELLECT, AND MOVEMENT**
- 4. SOUNDS THAT IMITATE ADULT LANGUAGE**
- 6. WHEN AN INFANT REACTS BY THROWING OUT HIS/ HER ARMS AND LEGS IN RESPONSE TO A LOUD NOISE.**
- 7. WHEN SOMETHING IS PUT IN A INFANTS MOUTH, THE BABY BEGINS TO SUCK.**
