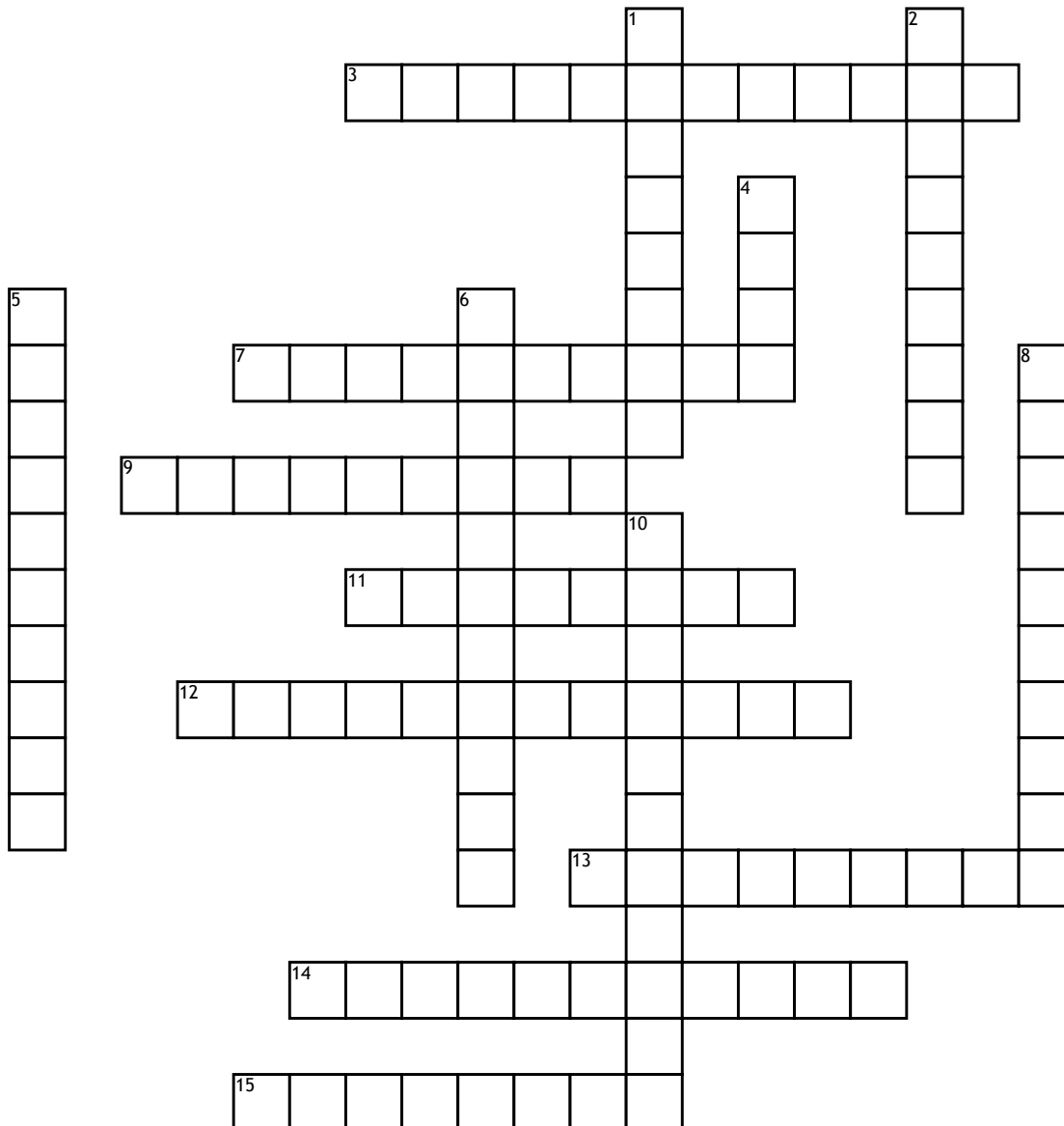

3. Arrangement of blood vessels in the body or in an organ or body part.

7. The act of binding up or fastening, as with bandages.

9. A small nipplelike projection, such as a protuberance on the skin, at the root of a hair or feather, or at the base of a developing tooth.

11. Yellowish discoloration of the whites of the eyes, skin, and mucous membranes caused by deposition of bile salts in these tissues. It occurs as a symptom of various diseases, such as hepatitis, that affect the processing of bile. Also called icterus.

12. Unusually high body temperature.

13. A black variety of garnet.

14. Of, relating to, or affecting the skin.

15. A horizontal layer of material, especially one of several parallel layers arranged one on top of another.

1. Complete or partial loss of hair from the head or other parts of the body.

2. Secreting fat or sebum.

4. A greenish blue, one of the subtractive primary colors.

5. Inflammation of the skin.

6. A cosmetic surgical procedure in which excess fatty tissue is removed from a specific area of the body, such as the thighs or abdomen, by means of suction. Also called suction lipectomy.

8. Any of several inherited conditions characterized by the reduction or absence of the pigment melanin in a person or animal, resulting in lack of pigmentation in the eyes, skin, and hair. Humans with albinism usually have vision problems.
