

- **4.** the extent to which a test samples the behavior that is of interest
- **5.** the extent to which a test yields consistent results (by using two halves of the test or retesting)
- **9.** a test that assesses what a person has learned
- 11. a condition of limited mental ability varying from mild to profound; shown by IQ of 70 or below
- 13. the ability to perceive, understand, manage, & use emotions
- **15.** the ratio of mental age to chronological age multiplied by 100

- **16.** a statistical procedure that identifies clusters of related items on a test Savant syndrome, a condition in which a person limited in mental ability has an exceptional specific skill, like drawing
- **17.** Defining meaningful scores by comparison with the performance of a pretested group
- **18.** a test that predicts a person's future performance
- 19. the ability to learn from experience, solve problems, and use knowledge to adapt to new situations
