

- **6.** The behavior or mental process that is measured in an experiment or quasi-experiment
- 7. Illustrates strength and direction of correlations; paired X and Y scores for each subject are plotted as single points on a graph
- **12.** The condition that exists when the probability that the observed findings are due to chance is less than 1 in 20 (p<.05) according to some psychologists, or less than 1 in 100 (p<.01) according to those with more stringent standards
- **13.** Provides a way of statistically combining the results of individual research studies to reach an overall conclusion
- **14.** A description of the specific procedure used to determine the presence of a variable

- 1. Factors that cause differences between the experimental group and the control group other than the independent variable
- **3.** Measures the average difference between each score and the mean of the data set
- **4.** The factor the researcher manipulates in a controlled experiment (the cause)

- 5. Research design in which participants don't know whether they are the experimental or control group
- **8.** A physical or psychological treatment given to the control group that resembles the treatment given to the experimental group, but that contains no active ingredient
- **9.** Consistency or repeatability of results
- **10.** The extent to which an instrument measures or predicts what it is supposed to measure or predict
- **11.** Choosing of members of a population so that every individual has an equal chance of being chosen to participate in a study
