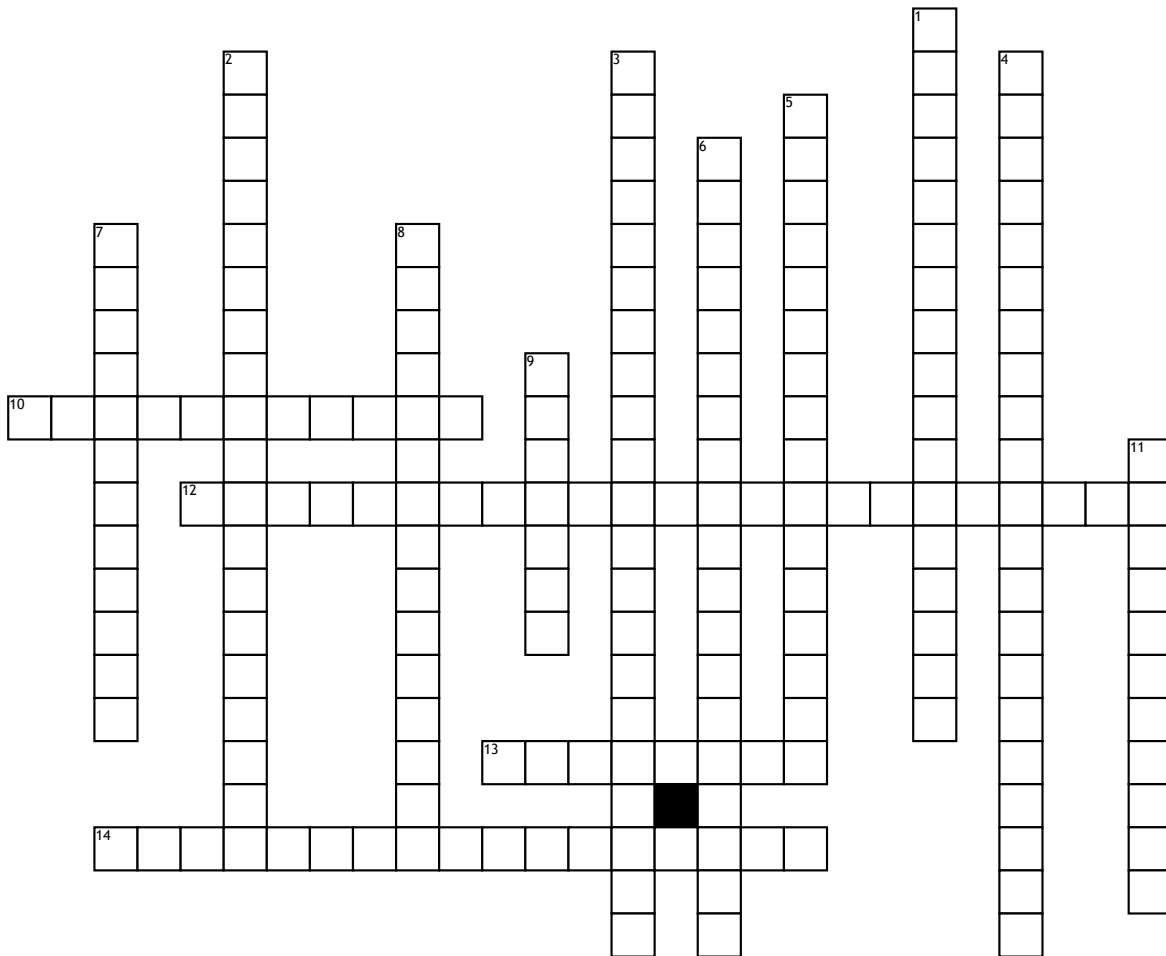

12. a measure of the likelihood that the difference between group results from a real difference between the two groups rather than from chance alone

13. the extent to which an instrument measures or predicts what it is supposed to

14. the behavior or mental process that is being answered

1. indicate the degree to which scores differ from each other and vary around the mean value for the set

2. the factor the researcher manipulates

3. the specific procedure used to determine the presence of a variable

4. the clues participants discover about the purpose of the study, including rumors they hear about the study suggesting how they should respond

5. a research design in which the participants do not know which treatment group-experimental or control-they are in

6. differences between the experimental group and the control group other than those resulting for the independent variable

7. provides a way of statistically combining the results of individual research studies to reach an overall conclusion
