

## <u>Across</u>

- **10.** a graph in which paired X and Y scores for each subject are plotted as single points, illustrating the strength and directions graphically
- **12.** a measure of the likelihood that the difference between group results from a real difference between the two groups rather than from chance alone
- **13.** the extent to which an instrument measures or predicts what it is supposed to
- **14.** the behavior or mental process that is being answered

- 1. indicate the degree to which scores differ from each other and vary around the mean value for the set
- **2.** the factor the researcher manipulates
- **3.** the specific procedure used to determine the presence of a variable
- **4.** the clues participants discover about the purpose of the study, including rumors they hear about the study suggesting how they should respond
- **5.** a research design in which the participants do not know which treatment group-experimental or control-they are in
