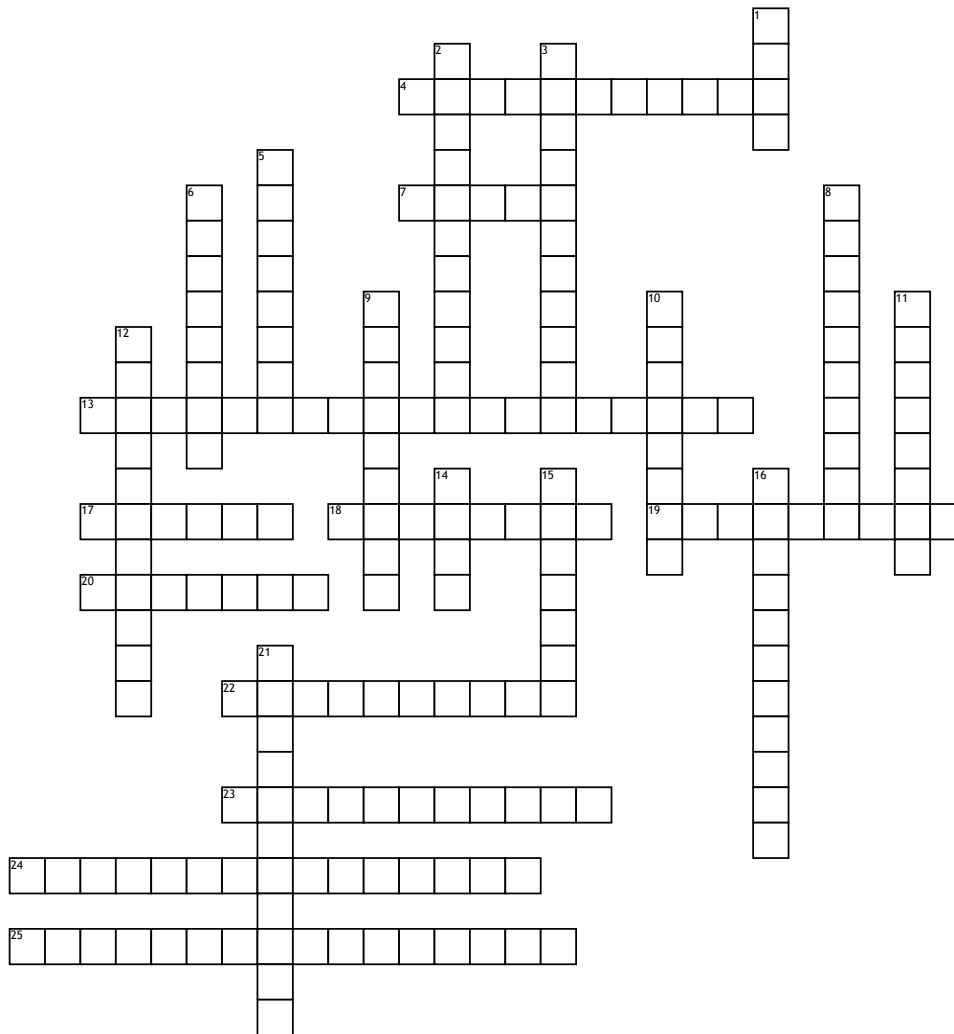

 13. A summary of a management's performance as reflected in the profitability (or lack of it) of an organization over a certain period.
 17. US electronic securities market that quotes prices through a computer network
 18. that part of the earnings of a corporation that is distributed to its shareholders; usually paid quarterly
 19. laying out money or capital in an enterprise with the expectation of profit
 20. wealth in the form of money or property owned by a person or business and human resources of economic value
 22. A stock market where a majority of investors are buying, causing overall stock prices to rise.
 23. Investment in which individual contributes money on a regular basis in order to reach a financial goal on a short or long term basis
 24. the act of introducing variety (especially in investments or in the variety of goods and services offered)

25. Investment strategy that seeks stocks (shares) with superior earnings growth prospect, irrespective of their prices.

1. a certificate of debt (usually interest-bearing or discounted) that is issued by a government or corporation in order to raise money; the issuer is required to pay a fixed sum annually until maturity and then a fixed sum to repay the principal
 2. the amount by which the purchase price of an asset exceeds the selling price
 3. organized trading of stocks through exchanges and over-the-counter.
 5. a fixed charge for borrowing money; usually a percentage of the amount borrowed
 6. an indicator of stock market prices
 8. A stock market where a majority of investors are selling, causing overall stock prices to drop.
 9. The study of resource allocation, distribution and consumption; of capital and investment; and of management of the factors of production.

10. a common stock of a nationally known company whose value and dividends are reliable; typically have high price and low yield

 12. responsible for implementing a fund's investing strategy and managing its portfolio
 14. The probability of loss inherent in an organization's operations and environment
 15. an expert who studies financial data (on credit or securities or sales or financial patterns etc.) and recommends appropriate business actions
 16. Scheme under which retirement benefits accrue and are distributed to the beneficiary employees.
 21. An investment vehicle managed by finance professionals that raises capital by selling shares (called units) in a chosen and balanced set of securities to the public.
