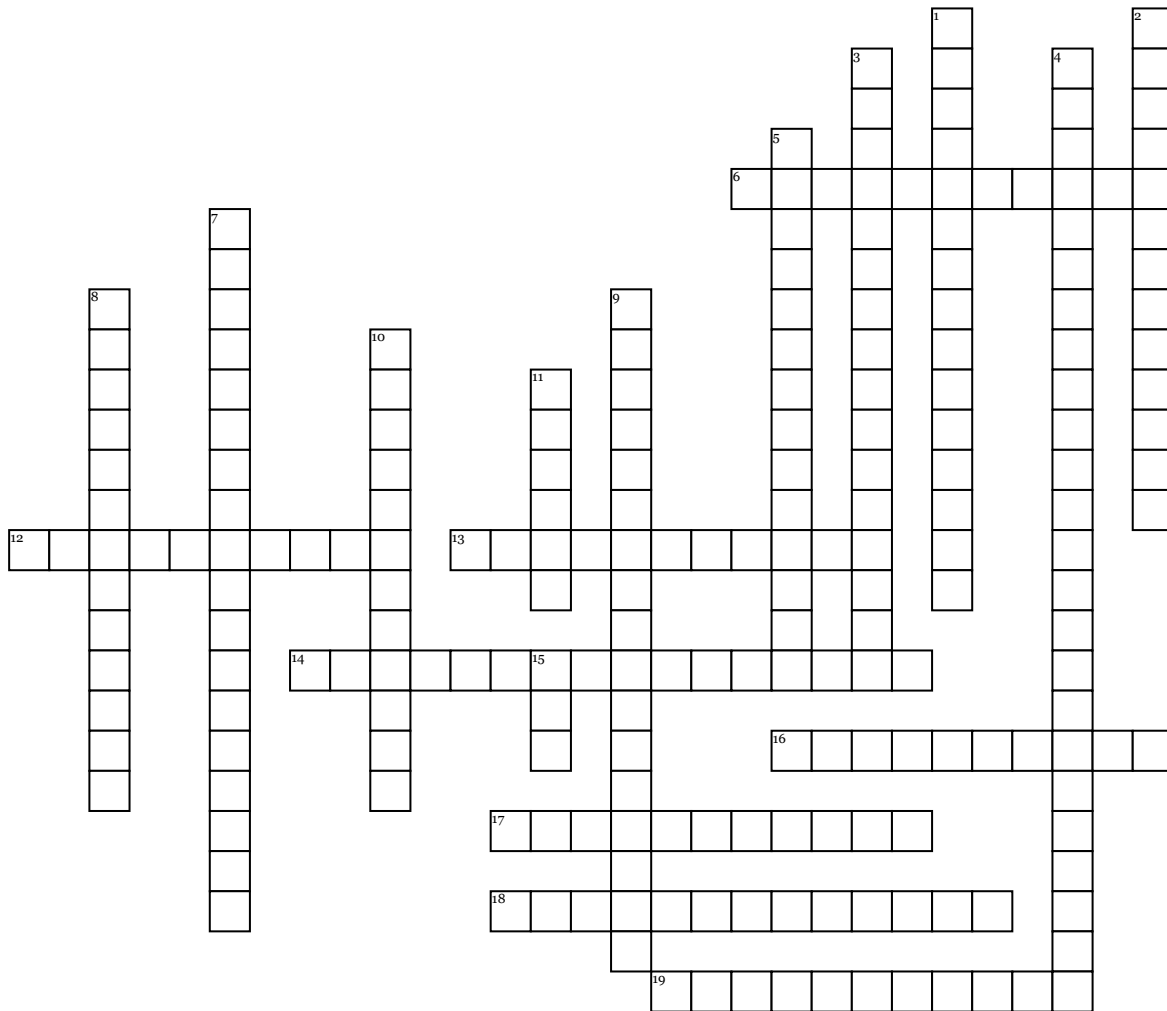


Jordans Crossword Puzzle
