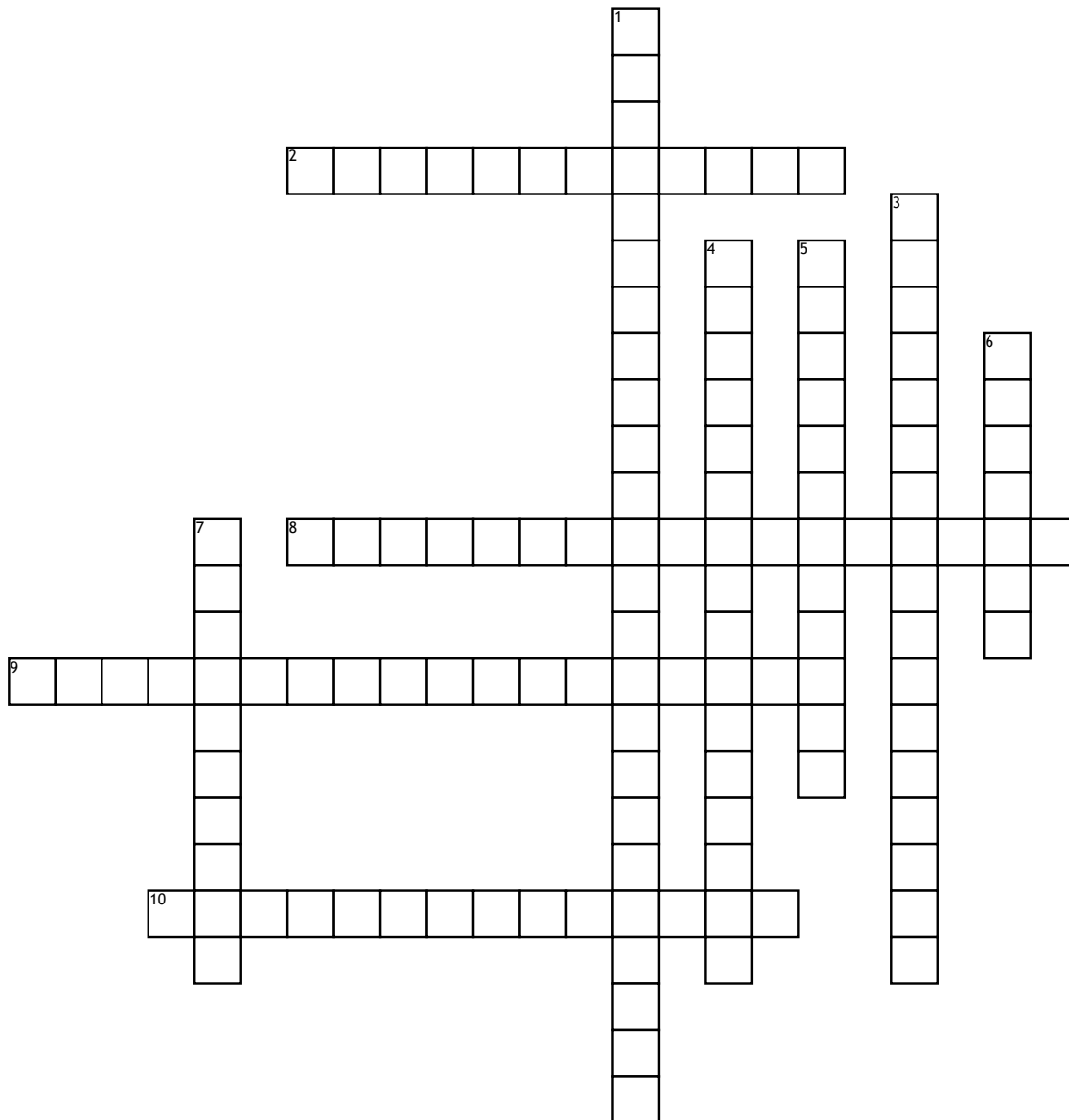

2. The act of abandoning one's country and giving up citizenship. Denaturalization. Process by which a naturalized citizen may involuntarily lose their citizenship.

8. The separation of different groups of people based on some characteristic. (e.g., race, religion, ethnicity) that is required by law.

9. Racial segregation that occurs in schools, not as a result of the law, but as a result of patterns of residential settlement. Civil Disobedience. Opposing a law one considers unjust by peacefully disobeying it and accepting the resultant punishment.

10. The law of blood, which determines citizenship based on one's parents' citizenship.

1. established by the Plessy v. Ferguson case that held that if facilities for both races were equal, they could be separate.

3. a policy designed to redress past discrimination against women and minority groups through measures to improve their economic and educational opportunities.

4. process to reverse citizenship; ONLY happens if authorities find out you lied on paperwork and really can not become a citizen. Expatriation. living out of native country: The U.S. allows citizens to renounce their citizenship.

5. The law of blood, which determines citizenship based on one's parents' citizenship.

6. the law of soil, which determines citizenship based on where a person is born.

7. were state and local laws passed from the end of Reconstruction in 1877 through the mid-1950s by which white southerners reasserted their dominance by denying African Americans basic social, economic, and civil rights, such as the right to vote.
