

1. A built in command which can be used to perform common mathematical operations such as addition, multiplication and rounding numbers.

- 2. The workspace made up of columns and rows where data is entered to create an electronic spreadsheet
- **3.** A unique identifier for a cell which is formed by combining the cell's column letter and row number
- **5.** A grid of rows and columns containing numbers, text, and formulas used to perform calculations.
- **6.** Numeric characters that can be used in a calculation
