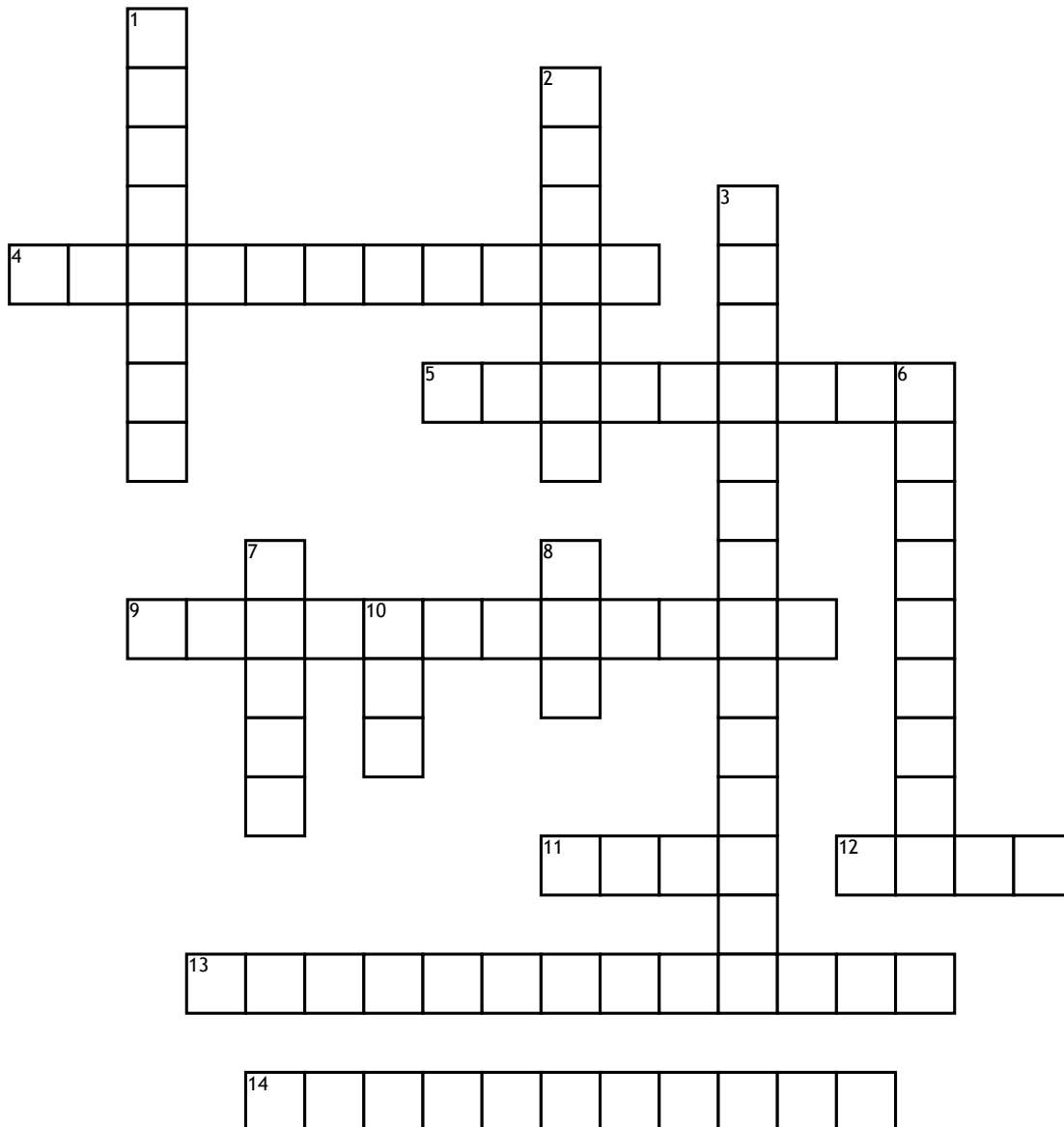

4. Refers to the width of a stitch and is a setting on a sewing machine.

5. An amount that is added to a measurement to give spare material for seams, turnings, hems or zips.

11. It is formed when thread, cord or rope is looped around on itself and pulled tight.

12. When fabric edges are worn by rubbing or continuous use.

13. Any of various foot-operated or electric machines for sewing or making stitches, ranging from machines with a shuttle for a spool of thread and a needle for sewing garments to industrial machines for sewing leather, book pages together, etc.

14. It is the process of arranging patterns on fabric to achieve as little waste as possible, for the most economical use of the fabric.

1. A technique in which fabric shapes are cut out and sewn onto a larger cloth background.

2. The general name given to any fabric, whether knitted or woven.

3. Single-spaced stitches which lie flat on the surface of the fabric.
