

- **4.** Refers to the width of a stitch and is a setting on a sewing machine.
- **5.** An amount that is added to a measurement to give spare material for seams, turnings, hems or zips.

- **12.** When fabric edges are worn by rubbing or continuous use.
- 13. Any of various foot-operated or electric machines for sewing or making stitches, ranging from machines with a shuttle for a spool of thread and a needle for sewing garments to industrial machines for sewing leather, book pages together, etc.
- **14.** It is the process of arranging patterns on fabric to achieve as little waste as possible, for the most economical use of the fabric.

1. A technique in which fabric shapes are cut out and sewn onto a larger cloth background.

- **2.** The general name given to any fabric, whether knitted or woven.
