


Key vocabulary used in research

- 5.** Adjective for a type of research into what other academics have written or said about the subject being studied, e.g. from academic books or articles.
- 7.** A piece of research which involves asking a subject questions and recording the answers. Detailed answers are not usually recorded; it aims to get a more general picture by using a larger sample.
- 8.** Adjective for a type of research which is 'pure', i.e. which is the author's own research rather than what other academics have written or said about something.
- 9.** A section in an academic paper which describes how the primary research is conducted, the decisions which were taken, and why.
- 10.** A type of research which produces results which are not countable or measurable, for example people's opinions or feelings.

- 1.** A shortened version of a longer text or group of texts which shows only the main ideas or points.
- 2.** Adjective for a type of research which produces results which are measurable or countable (e.g. any kind of number or yes/no answers).
- 3.** A section of a research paper which summarises, analyses and synthesises the secondary research relevant to the subject.
- 4.** A purely qualitative method of research, it involves asking a subject questions and recording the answers in detail.
- 6.** The number of people or objects studied in a piece of research.
