

- 3. Romantic or sexual attraction to members of one sex or gender only
- **6.** Systemic violence against trans people, associated with attitudes such as fear, discomfort, distrust, or disdain. This word is used similarly to homophobia, xenophobia, misogyny, etc.
- **10.** (two words, no space) Anxiety and/or discomfort regarding one's sex assigned at birth.
- 11. Refers to those who identify as two genders.
- **12.** Capable of being attracted to many/any gender(s). Sometimes the term omnisexual is used in the same manner.
- **13.** (two words, no space) A person's internal, deeply held sense of their gender

14. Adjective that means "identifies as their sex assigned at birth" derived from the Latin word meaning "on the same side."

<u>Down</u>

- 1. Term referring to the assumption that heterosexuality is the norm, which plays out in interpersonal interactions and society and furthers the marginalization of queer people
- **2.** (two words, no space) Describes a person's enduring physical, romantic, and/or emotional attraction to another person
- **4.** An umbrella term for people whose gender identity and/or gender expression differs from what is typically associated with the sex they were assigned at birth

- **5.** (two words, no space) The physical manifestation of one's gender identity through clothing, hairstyle, voice, body shape, etc. (typically referred to as masculine or feminine).
- 7. A person's process of developing and assuming a gender expression to match their gender identity. Can include: coming out to one's family, friends, and/or co-workers; changing one's name and/or sex on legal documents; hormone therapy; and possibly (though not always) some form of surgery.
- **8.** At birth, infants are assigned this; The classification of a person as male or female
- **9.** A term used by some people who experience their gender identity and/or gender expression as falling outside the categories of man and woman
