

- **2.** Born > 3 weeks before due date
- **7.** Total oxygen deprivation at birth
- **8.** When the placenta detaches from the wall of the uterus before delivery, causing bleeding for mother
- **9.** When your baby's head turns to one side, the arm on that side will straighten with the opposite arm bent
- **10.** Breaking amnion to hopefully prompt the body to go into labor on its own

- **12.** A white, cheese-like substance called vernix at one time covered your baby's skin to protect it while in the bag or waters
- 14. Oxygen deficiency at birth
- **15.** A surgical cut made on the opening of the vagina to avoid tearing and to aid in the birth process

1. The umbilical cord comes out before the baby and this could cause the baby to put pressure on the cord and disrupt blood flow to the baby

- **3.** Baby's body is covered with fine downy hair, most noticeable on the back, shoulders, and ear lobes
- 4. Pain Medication
- **5.** When the placenta covers the cervix
- **6.** With each contraction, the mother pushes, forcing the baby down the birth canal
