

- **6.** What is the type of aphasia that is characterized by the inability to repeat words that are heard, but have the ability to speak normally & comprehend the speech of others?

- 7. What happens when damage occurs to Wernicke's area or there is disruption of auditory input to the region?
- **9.** What is a form of aphasia that is characterized by poor speech comprehension and fluent but meaningless speech?
