

Latin American Instruments

- **1.** A long drum played with the palms of the users hands
- **2.** A pair of small copper-shelled drums that sound like tom-toms.
- 7. Produces a dull, deep thud and is played using wooden sticks
- **8.** The sound is created from the movement of many beads strung together
- **9.** A hollow instrument with 1 open end and occasionally a thumb hold underneath

- 11. An instrument consisting of 2 different sized bells connected by a strip of metal curved into a "u" shape
- **12.** 2 medium sized drums that produce an energetic, bouncy sound
- **13.** 2 wooden sticks clapped together
- **14.** Produces an eerie, breathy, flute-like sound.

3. Produces a scrapey wood like sound when it's bumpy surface is scrapped with a stick.

- **4.** An idiophone that sounds like little beads are being shaken in a container
- **5.** This instrument has 10 strings in 5 pairs and was originally made from armadillo shell.
- **6.** As well as being used as an instrument it is used for farmers to know where abouts their cattle are.
- **10.** An aerophone consisting of a mouth piece 6 finger holes and 1 thumb hole
