

- **7.** A location where transfer is possible from one mode of transportation to another
- **9.** A place to dispose of waste materials by burying it
- **10.** A gas that absorbs ultraviolet radiation, found in the stratosphere
- **13.** A US law that prevents a union and company from negotiating a contract that requires workers to join the union as a condition of employment
- **16.** An industry for which labor costs comprise a high percentage of total expenses
- **17.** Wealth in the form of money or other assets used for a particular business such as starting a business

- **18.** Location factors related to the costs of factors of production inside a plant, such as land, labor, and capital
- **19.** A fabric made by weaving, used in making clothing
- 20. Sulfur oxides and nitrogen oxides, emitted by fossil fuels that enter the atmosphere and combine with oxygen and water to create sulfuric and nitric acid and come back down to Earth

- 1. a series of improvements in the industrial technology that transformed the process of manufacturing goods
- **3.** Location factors related to the transportation of materials into and from a factory.
- **4.** An atmospheric condition formed through a combination of weather conditions and pollution, especially from motor vehicle emissions

- **5.** The anticipated increase in Earth's temperature caused by carbon dioxide trapping some of the radiation emitted by the surface
- **6.** Conversion of sulfur oxides and nitrogen oxides to acids that return to Earth as rain, snow, or fog
- **8.** A gas used as a solvent, a propellant in aerosols, a refrigerant, and in plastic foams and fire extinguishers
- 11. Concentration of trace substances (like carbon monoxide) at a greater level than occurs in normal air
- **12.** The amount of oxygen required by aquatic bacteria to decompose a given load of organic waste
- 14. Likely to decay or go bad quickly
- **15.** A factory built by a US company in Mexico near the US border, to take advantage of the much lower labor costs in Mexico
