

- 1. Doing something illegal or morally wrong. Malfeasance includes dishonesty and abuse of authority
- **3.** A legal document issued by the court ordering a person to appear as specified and give testimony and/or produce evidence
- **4.** The person or party sued in a civil case or accused in a criminal case
- **5.** A civil wrong, giving rise to a cause of action, independent of contract.
- **6.** a threat or an attempt to harm another person with eh apparent ability to do so.

- **7.** Failure to exercise that degree of care that a reasonable person would exercise under the same circumstances
- 8. The party who initiates a legal action; in a personal injury lawsuit, the person who alleges that he or she has suffered monetary damages due the negligence of another party
