

- **5.** The minimum number of members who must be present to permit a legislative body to take official action
- **6.** A formal accusation of misconduct in office against a public official.
- 7. An agreement by two or more lawmakers to support each other's bills
- **12.** Provisions tacked on to a piece of legislation that are not relevant to the bill, to benefit an officeholder
- **14.** Citizens who who elect a person to represent them

- **16.** Having two bodies. Established by the Great Compromise
- **18.** Head of Representatives, from majority party, controls the floor
- **20.** Congressional power to pass a law despite presidential veto

- 1. A lengthy speech designed to delay or kill the vote on a bill; used only in the Senate
- **3.** The drawing of legislative district boundaries to benefit a party, group, or incumbent
- **8.** A local meeting of legislative political party members to conduct party business
- **9.** Puts an end to the filibuster
- **10.** Elected official who is already in office
- **11.** Part of Constitution that establishes the legislative branch of the federal government
- 13. Involving two political parties.
- 15. Head of the Senate
