

- 1. close objects have clear detail; far objects seem fuzzy
- **2.** looking down on something from the viewpoint of being up in the air above it
- **4.** looking up at something from the viewpoint of being down on the ground
- **5.** close objects appear larger; far objects appear smaller

- **6.** a drawing method for creating the illusion of three-dimensional space on a two-dimensional surface
- **8.** lines spaced equally apart that will never cross or come together
- **10.** objects near the bottom of the picture appear closer to the viewer; objects higher on the page will appear farther away
- 11. the area on the horizon line that is shown in an artist's picture
- **14.** placing closer objects so they partially cover objects that are behind them
