


Literary Devices

- figure of speech that refers to a well-known story, event, person, or object
- when a character speaks aloud to himself (and to the audience), thereby revealing his inner thoughts and feelings
- an author indirectly hints at what's to come later on in the story.
- the author's attitude towards his/her writing
- a comparison without using "like" or "as"
- A genre that tells only about a certain period of time or about a certain story arc of the author's life
