

- **7.** The narrator reports observed actions
- **10.** The narrator enters the mind of only one character
- **12.** A recurrent image, word, phrase, represented object or action
- 13. Writing that tells a story
- **14.** The sequence of events in a story line
- **16.** Once character is speaking aloud at great length, usually alone
- **17.** The time and place where a story occurs

- **18.** Important background information is revealed
- **19.** The falling action of a narrative, when the climax and central conflicts are resolved
- **21.** Conversation between two or more character
- 23. Sets the stage for further conflict
- 25. The identity of the narrative voice
- **26.** Same as first person but narrator is telling events of a story as they happened many years ago
