
Literary Terms - #1



- 1. method of characterization in which the author tells the reader directly what the character is like
- **6.** two or more ideas, places, characters, and their actions are placed side by side in a narrative or a poem, for the purpose of developing comparisons and contrasts.
- 7. Stopping the Forward action to recount a past event to supply background material or maintain suspense
- 12. an author shows readers a character's traits through that character's actions and/or words

- 13. Minor character whose role sharpens our understanding of a major character by providing a contrast
- 14. undergoes a major transition in one or more of ways by the end of the story Down
