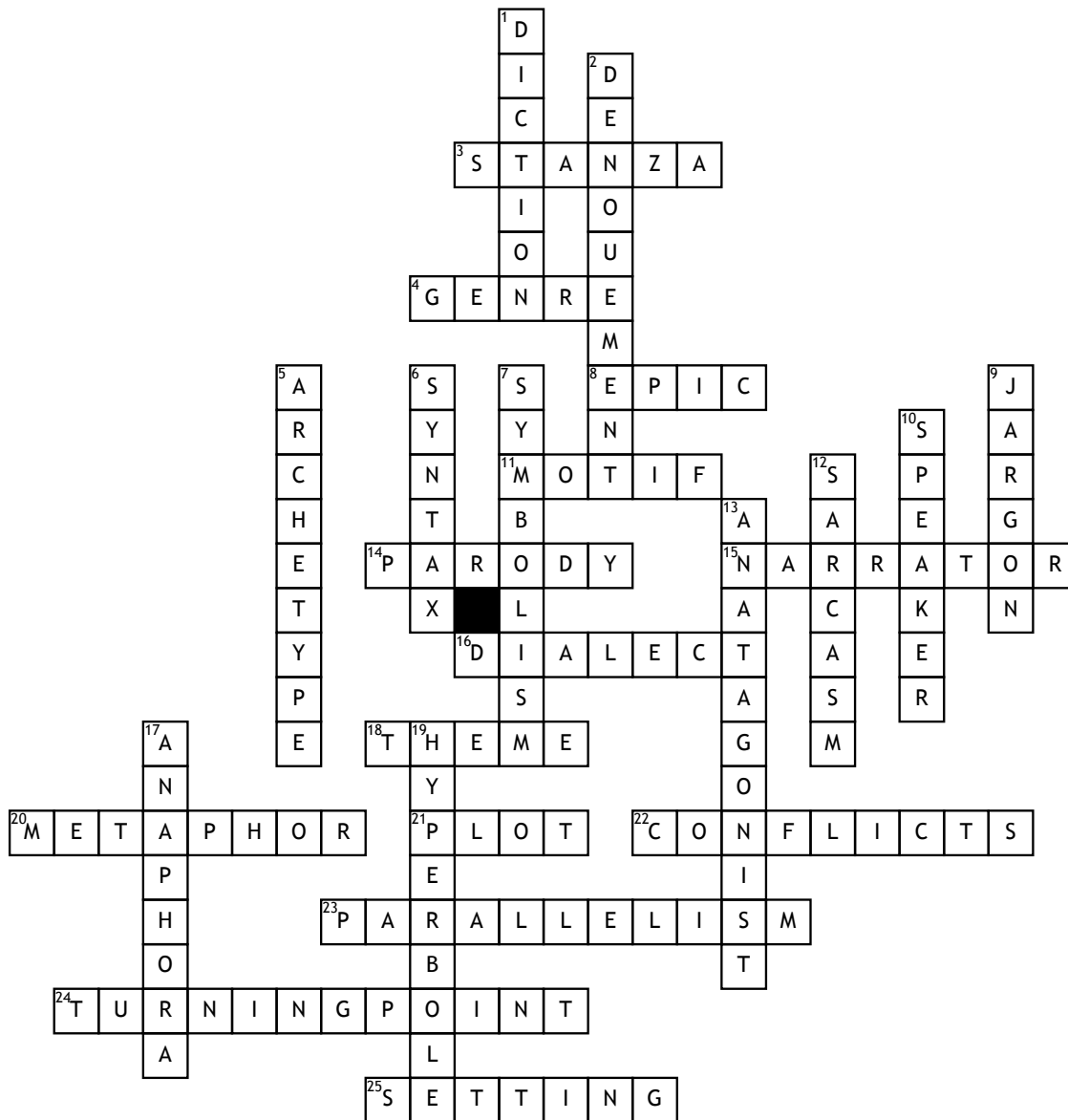


Literary Word Crossword Puzzle
