

- 1. was a hero and god of medicine in ancient Greek religion and mythology
- 2. one of the sons of Hypnos (Somnus), the god of sleep
- 3. is the deep abyss that is used as a dungeon of torment and suffering for the wicked and as the prison for the Titans
- **8.** is one of the primordial deities, the first-born elementals
- 9. was the Greek god of attraction
- **11.** was a hero and god of medicine in ancient Greek religion and mythology
- **13.** was the goddess who enacted retribution against those who succumb to hubris (arrogance before the gods)

- **15.** was the mortal lover of the goddess Aphrodite in Greek mythology
- **16.** was the primal Greek god personifying the sky and one of the Greek primordial deities
- **19.** is the primeval state of existence from which the first gods appeared
- **20.** representing the personification of darkness

- **4.** is the goddess of the moon. She is the daughter of the Titans Hyperion and Theia, and sister of the sun-god Helios, and Eos, goddess of the dawn
- **5.** the immortal goddess of harmony and concord

- **6.** was a son of Hippotes who is mentioned in Odyssey and the Aeneid as the Keeper of the Winds
- 7. is an early sea-god or god of rivers and oceanic bodies of water, one of several deities whom Homer calls the "Old Man of the Sea
- 10. was a river god
- **12.** the god of fertility and ruler of the underworld

- **17.** is the Greek goddess (or personification) of the night
- **18.** the god of the wild, shepherds and flocks, nature of mountain wilds, rustic music and impromptus, and companion of the nymphs.
