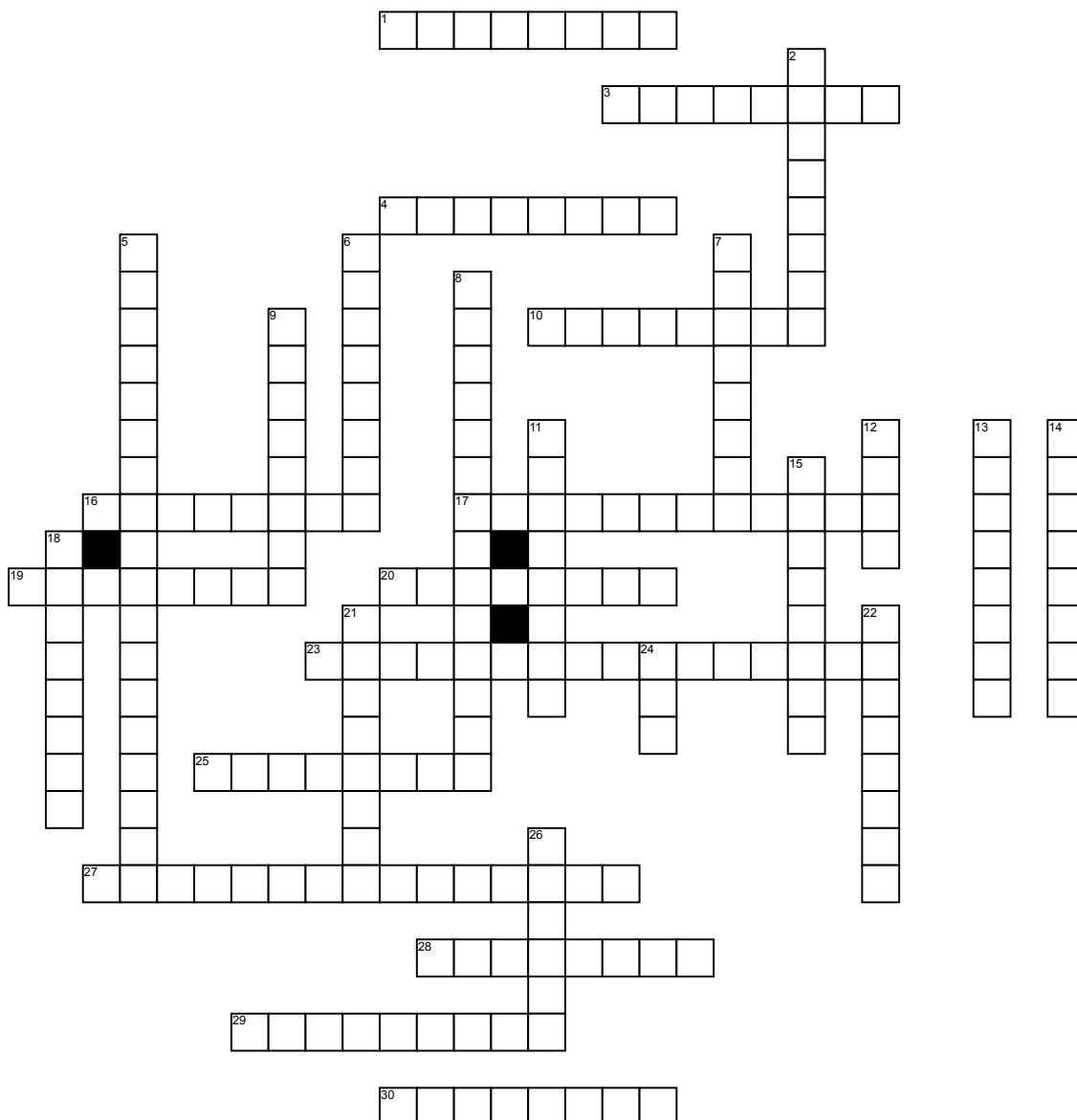


Mac commands



Across

1. Move to the end of a line or paragraph
3. Move to the beginning of the line of paragraph.
4. Move down one line
10. Paste the contents of the Clipboard into the current document or app. This also works for files in the folder
16. Center the cursor or selection in the visible area.
17. Preferences: Open preferences for the front app
19. Show or hide the Fonts window.
20. Select all items.
23. Find misspelled words in the document.
25. Find items in a document or open a Find window.

27. Show or hide the definition of the selected word.

28. Scroll down one page
29. Print the current document
30. New: Open a new document or window.

Down

2. Save the current document.
5. Display the Spelling and Grammar window.
6. Move up one line
7. Move on character backward
8. Screenshot: Take a screenshot of a selected area.
9. Insert a new line after the insertion point
11. Underline the selected text, or turn underlining on or off.
12. To the beginning of a document

13. Cut the selected item and copy it to the Clipboard.

14. Undo the previous command. You can then press Command-Shift-Z to Redo, reversing the undo command. In some apps, you can undo and redo multiple commands.

15. Move one character forward

18. Copy the selected item to the the Clipboard. This also works for files in the Finder.

21. Boldface the selected text, or turn boldfacing on or off.

22. Italicize the selected text, or turn boldfacing on or off.

24. To the end of a document

26. Scroll up one page.
