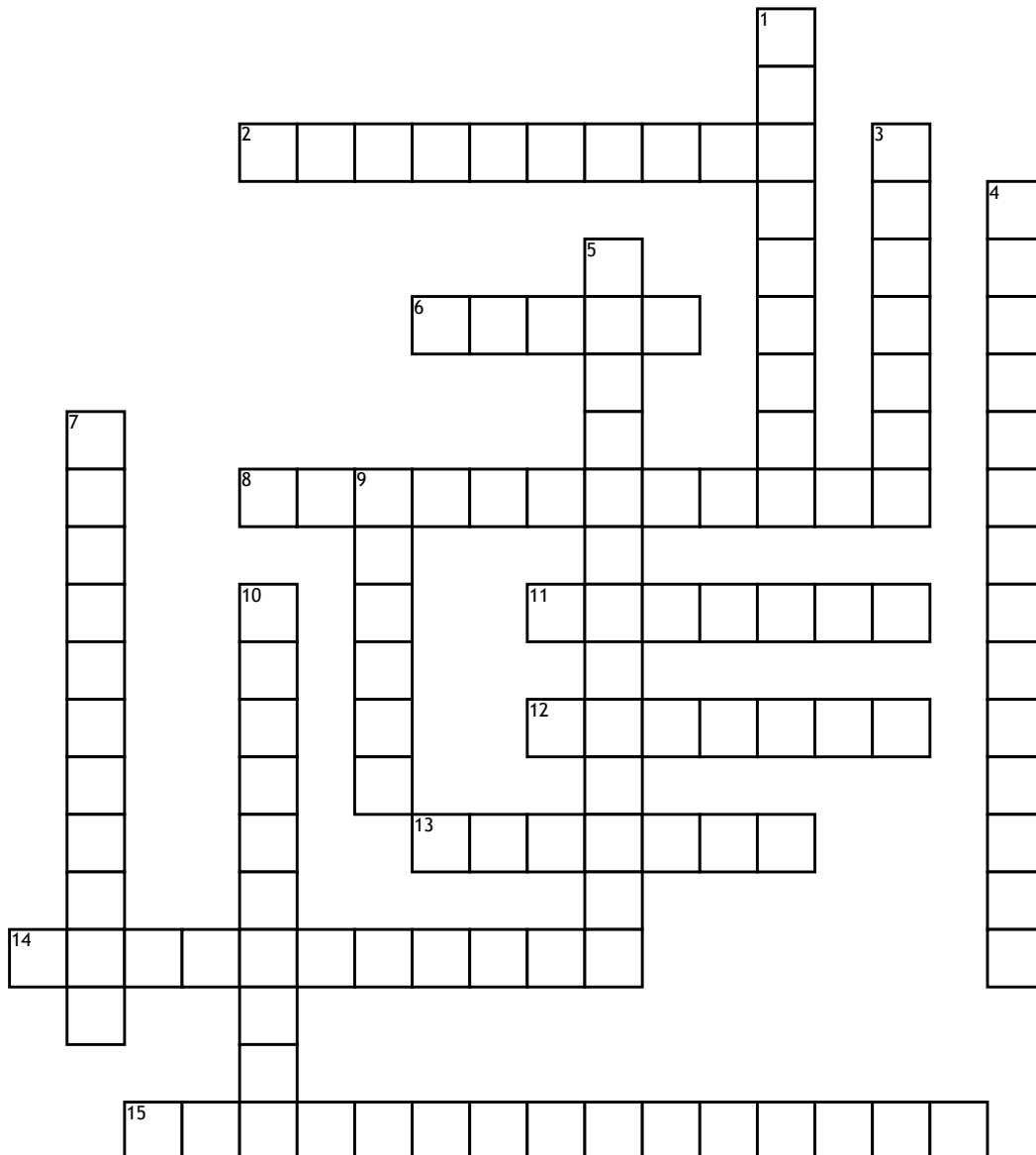

2. A profession that diagnoses and treats conditions of the foot, ankle, and related structures of the leg.

6. A fluid-filled sac or saclike cavity, especially one countering friction at a joint.

8. A condition in which bones become weak and brittle.

11. A cancer of plasma cells.

12. The action of bending or the condition of being bent, especially the bending of a limb or joint.

13. An eye movement involving only one eye.

14. Eight small bones that make up the wrist.

15. An inflammation of the cartilage that connects a rib to the breastbone.

1. Inflammation of one or more joints, causing pain and stiffness that can worsen with age.

3. The seven bones of the human tarsus form the ankle and upper part of the foot.

4. A cancer composed of cells derived from transformed cells that produce cartilage.

5. Inflammation of bone caused by infection, generally in the legs, arm, or spine.

7. Affecting the gums and other tissues surrounding the teeth.

9. The part of the body of a mammal between the neck and the abdomen, including the cavity enclosed by the ribs, breastbone, and dorsal vertebrae, and containing the chief organs of circulation and respiration; the chest.

10. The development of secondary malignant growths at a distance from a primary site of cancer.
