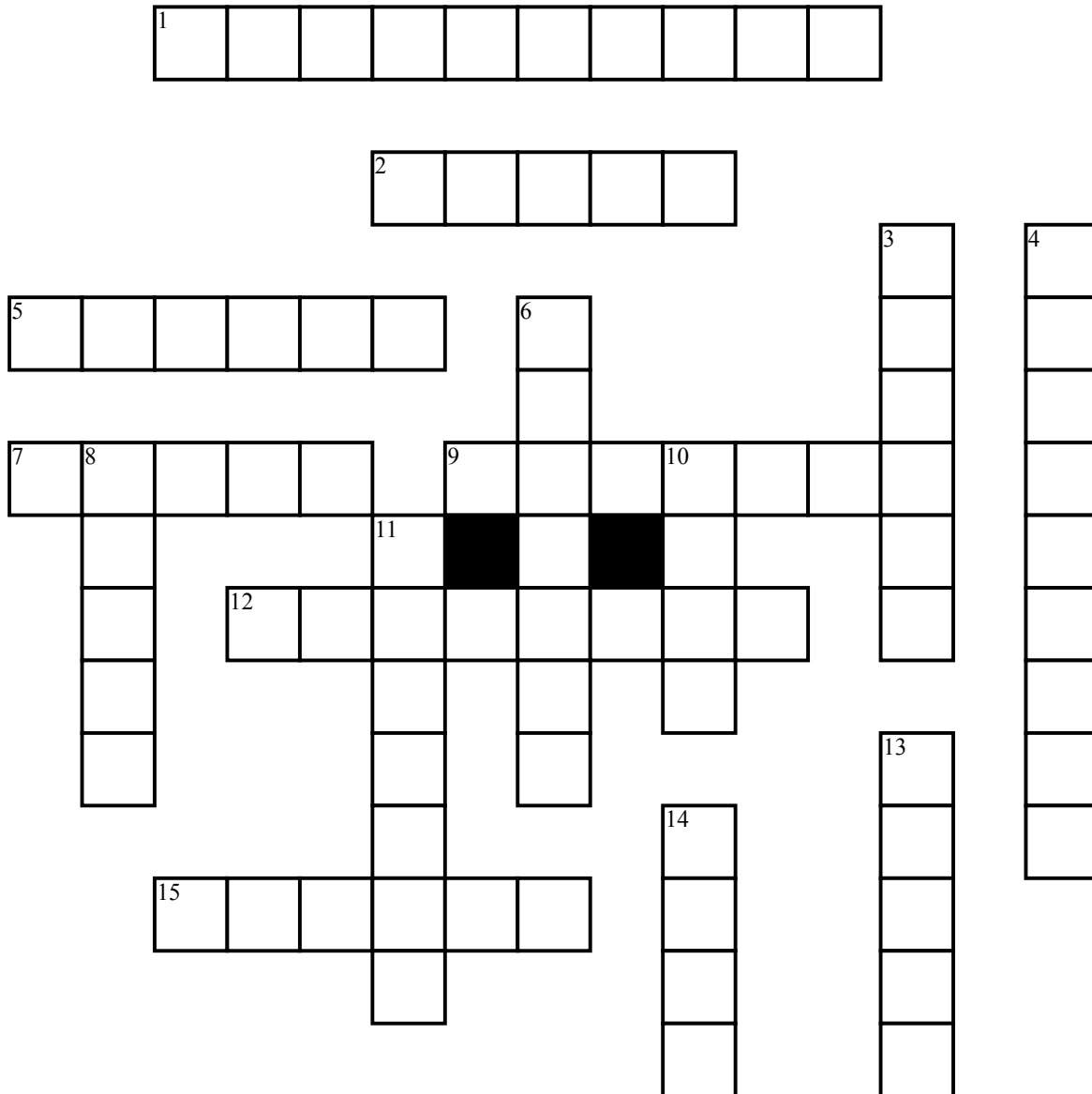


Medieval Crossword
