

- 3. 13) Castle walls were always very thick to withstand bombardment.
- 6. 7) People of high birth, such as dukes and earls. They were the people who lived in the castles
- **8.** 4) a self-contained weapons platform housing guns and capable of rotation usually positioned to provide a clear field of view and fire.
- 9. 11) low places in battlements through which you can look and shoot castle walls with open spaces for when you fight

- **10.** 8) a small building or place set aside for prayer and worship which was positioned within the castle walls.
- 12. 9) Buildings set aside for food preparation and placed within the walls near the keep.
- 13. 1) ditch dug as a fortification and usually filled with water that often surrounded a castle.

1. 5) Low walls built on top of shooting

- 2. 2) Allowed access into castle and a heavy metal portcullis protected
- 4. 10) holes hidden above a castle's doors through which boiling hot liquids could be dumped, or rocks hurled down on invaders
- **5.** 3) gate consisting of an iron or wooden grating that hangs in the entry to a castle or fortified town
- 7. 12) A solid portion between two crenéls in a battlement
- 11. 6) people who worked the land or served the nobles
