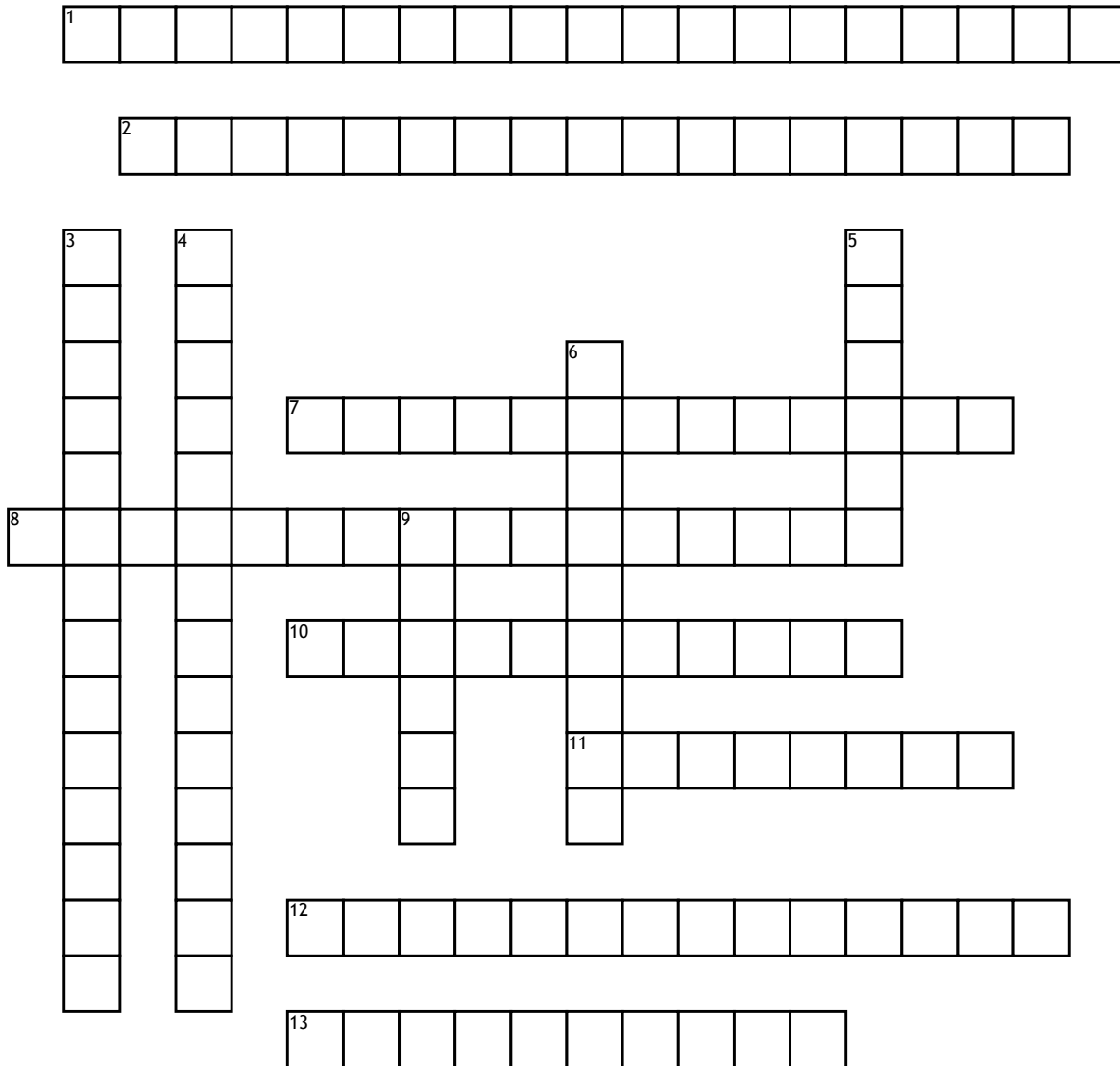


Memory

- 1. Non-conscious encoding of incidental information.
- 2. Encoding information on basic auditory or visual levels based on the sound, structure or appearance of a word.
- 7. Processing of incoming auditory and visual-spatial information.
- 8. Memory on how we remember to do things, like ride a bike or read.

- 10. A measure of memory in which the person need only identify items previously learned.
- 11. Organizing items into familiar, manageable units.
- 12. Memory of facts and experiences that one can consciously know and declare.
- 13. A measure of memory that assesses the amount of time saved.

- 3. Encodes semantically, based on actual meaning associated with the word.
- 4. Retention independent of conscious recollection.
- 5. Learning that has persisted over time, stored and can be recalled.
