
Middle Ear



Across

- **5.** The three smallest bones in the body.
- **7.** Activated by a puff of air to the face.
- 8. The seventh cranial nerve.
- **9.** A large irregular cavity that leads backward from the epitympanic recess into the tympanic or mastoid antrum.
- **10.** Located on the superior wall of the middle ear. Contains the head of the malleus and the body of the incus.
- **11.** This ascends from the tympanic cavity through a small canal on the under surface of the petrous portion of the temporal bone.

Down

- **1.** One of three cranial nerves involved in taste that runs through the middle ear.
- **2.** a small nerve originating in the tympanic plexus that carries preganglionic parasympathetic fibers to the otic ganglion.
- **3.** A rounded hollow prominence, formed by the projection outward of the first turn of the cochlea
- **4.** The pars tensa and the pars flaccida make up this.
- 6. Smallest muscle in human body.
