

- 2. The United States Supreme Court made a historic ruling in the case of Obergefell v. Hodges legalizing same-sex marriage in this year.
- 7. In July of 1958 the NAACP sponsored this kind of nonviolent protest in support of equal rights for African Americans
- 8. On January 29th, 1907 this Kansas Senator was the first person of Native American decent to hold this office.
- **10.** After struggling for many years, this group finally received a civil rights bill in 1968

- **11.** This amendment to the United States Constitution guarantees the right to religious freedom.
- **13.** One of the most famous American Civil Rights activists, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was originally born on January 15, 1929 in this state.

- In 1917 this woman became the first female Representative of the United States Congress
- **3.** Susan B. Anthony was a historic civil rights activist and was instrumental to this movement focused on women's rights.
- **4.** In 2004 this State became the first to issue marriage licenses to same-sex couples.

- **5.** On October 16, 1995 a huge crowd, advocating for the African American Civil Rights Movement, gathered in Washington DC for this historic event.
- **6.** Ratified on August 18, 1920, the 19th Amendment of the U.S. Consitution granted this group the right to vote.
- **9.** In 1964 this historic civil rights leader founded the Organization of Afro-American Unity
- **12.** In 1988 Barack Obama, the first African American President of the United States, enrolled in this prestigious law school.
