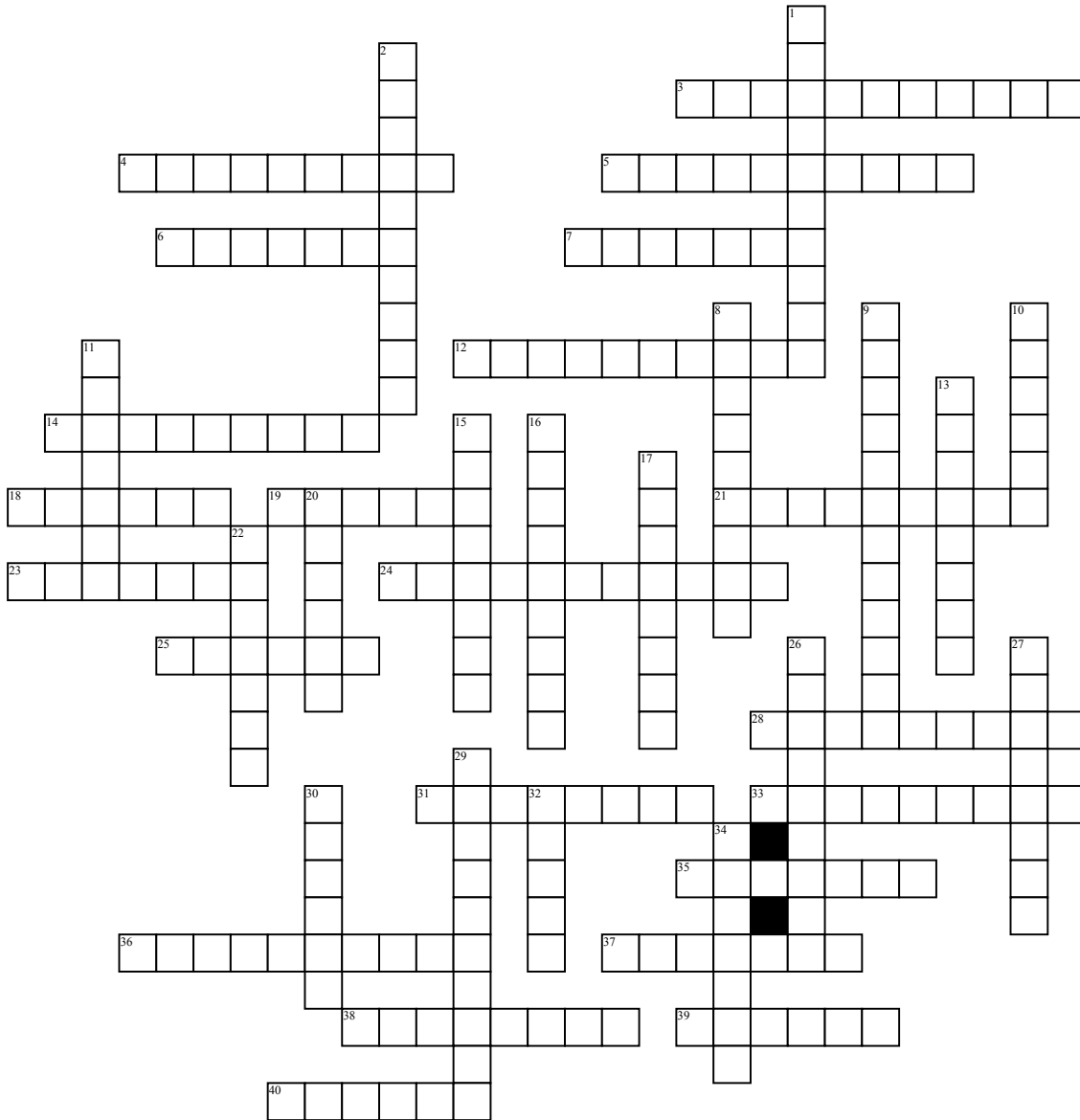


Monster Crossword
