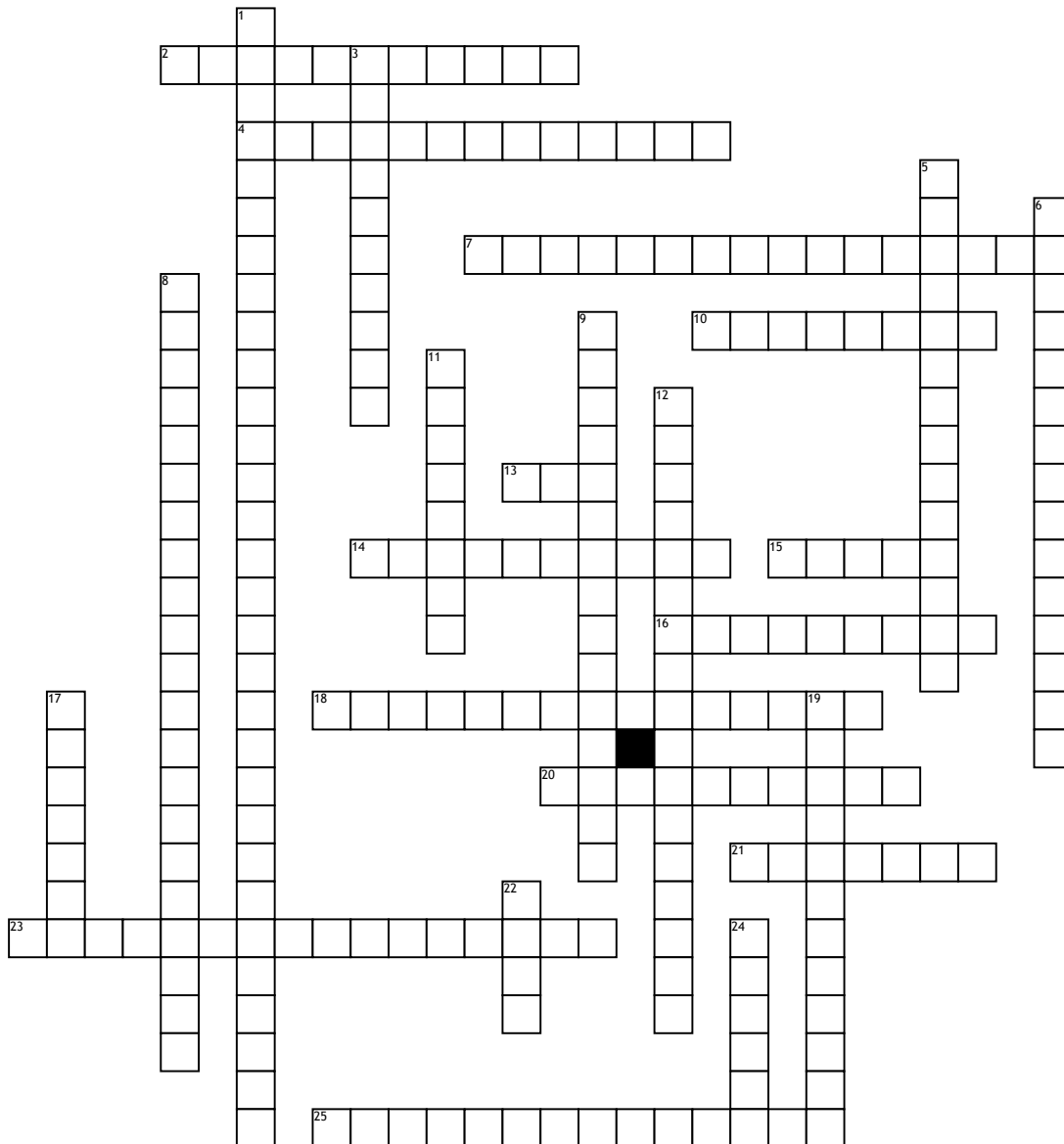


# Mr Winthrop Vocab Crossword
