He saw the Caribbean colony of Saint Domingue as an important naval base from which he could contol such an empire. 10. Federalists supported President Adams for a second term and Charles Pinckney for vice president. Republicans nominated Thomas Jefferson for president and Aaron Burr as his running mate. Hundreds of letters were sent to leading citizens and newspapers to make candidate's views public
